THE ALUMINUM PRODUCTS INDUSTRY - 1948

As reviewed in this report, the Aluminum Products Industry covers only the operations of factories which were occupied chiefly in casting, rolling or fabricating aluminum to make bars, rods, sheets, wire, cable, foil, cooking utensils, etc. It does not include the primary aluminum smelters as these works have been classified to the Non-ferrous Smelting and Refining Industry which is reviewed in a separate pamphlet. Nor does it include the aluminum castings, cable, utensils, etc., which were made as secondary or minor products of brass and iron foundries or other manufacturing establishments.

Seventy-two factories were classified to this industry in 1948, including 3 rolling mills. Of the remaining plants, 26 were occupied chiefly in the manufacture of miscellaneous castings, 12 made cooking utensils, 5 made match plates and patterns, 3 made die castings, 2 made hat dies and blocks, 2 made knitting needles, 15 made miscellaneous items, while boot and shoe lasts, thermit welding supplies, window sash and nails were each made by 1 plant.

Employees in this industry numbered 5,604; salaries and wages totalled \$11,616,902; materials used in manufacturing processes cost \$22,080,321, and production was valued at \$46,797,436. This value was 17.4 per cent over the \$39,849,383 of 1947.

Output of aluminum cooking utensils in this industry was valued at \$6,877,081, but in addition, concerns in other industries made aluminum-ware worth \$1,643,009, bringing the total for Canada to \$8,520,090. In 1947 the corresponding total was \$7,333,484, and in 1946 \$7,605,470.
