Manufactures of the Non-ferrous Metals

THE BRASS AND COPPER PRODUCTS INDUSTRY, 1947

This report covers the operations of brass foundries and other plants in Canada engaged chiefly in the manufacture of commodities (other than electrical equipment) from brass, bronze or copper. One hundred and fifteen foundries and 46 fabricating plants reported under this industry in 1947, and their production was valued at \$96,549,840. In 1946 the corresponding output value amounted to \$72,056,922, and in 1945 to \$105,150,750.

Products manufactured during 1947 by firms in this group included ingots, bars, rods, plates, sheets, tubing, and such further fabricated lines as wire cloth, valves, kettles and tanks, plumbing supplies, gas and water meters, fire extinguishers, lightning rods, metal fasteners, automobile hardware, etc. Copper wire and cable, lighting fixtures, switches and other such articles for electrical purposes have not been listed in this group but have been classified to the Electrical Apparatus and Supplies Industry which is dealt with in a separate report.

Brass foundry departments which were run by iron foundries or by manufacturers of machinery, farm implements, etc., as a secondary or minor part of their operations, are not included in this group as, in such instances, separate reports were not required for the brass foundry divisions and all data concerning same were included in the industries of major importance. It is believed that there are in Canada about 500 brass foundries in all.

A total of 161 plants was included in this group during 1947, of which 94 were located in Ontario, 39 in Quebec, 17 in British Columbia, 7 in Manitoba, 1 in New Brunswick and 3 in Alberta. Ontario factories accounted for 65 per cent of the total production and Quebec plants for 30 per cent.

The average number of employees in 1947 was 10,417 compared with 10,252 in 1946, and salaries and wages aggregated \$21,227,616 as against \$18,425,724 for the previous year.
