THE BRIDGE BUILDING AND STRUCTURAL STEEL WORK INDUSTRY, 1945.

The value of work done by concerns in the Bridge Building and Structural Steel Work Industry amounted to \$46,435,278 in 1945 compared with \$58,409,746 in the previous year.

This industry includes all concerns which were occupied chiefly in fabricating or erecting steel for bridges, buildings, etc., and in 1945 covered the operations of 23 plants, of which 12 were located in Ontario, 6 in Quebec, 2 in British Columbia, 2 in Manitoba and 1 in Alberta.

These firms afforded employment to a monthly average of 7,057 people who were paid \$15,087,130 in salaries and wages. Fuel and electricity cost \$806,164 and expenditures for materials for use in manufacturing amounted to \$18,908,255.

The principal products were: 3,116 tons of bridges at \$682,801; 80,724 tons of other structural work, such as buildings, transmission towers, etc., at \$15,228,842; plate and tank work at \$1,074,482 and mechanical work, including cranes, trolleys, etc., at \$1,848,766. Sales of plain material were reported at 67,617 tons worth \$6,507,145.
