During the year 153 factories in Canada made hardware and tools as their principal products and, of this total, 91 were located in Ontario, 28 in Quebec, 7 in British Columbia, 4 in New Brunswick and 3 in Nova Scotia. These works reported fixed and working capital at \$32,259,387, the number of employees at 6,220 and payments for salaries and wages at \$6,717,192. Purchased materials for manufacturing cost \$6,713,290 and the value added was \$14,760,865.

Among the principal products, listed in order according to total 1930 selling value, were: - razor blades; bolts, nuts and rivets; builders and other hardware, screws, saws, knitting machine needles, axes, shock absorbers, spades and shovels, forks, automobile transmissions, hoisting machinery, dies, taps and stocks; drills, files and rasps, safety razors, skates, rail anchors and many other articles.
