



THE JEWELLERY AND SILVERWARE INDUSTRY

1949

Manufacturers of jewellery, silverware and other precious metal products reported the value of their 1949 production at \$50,757,460, which was an increase of 20 per cent over the total of \$42,179,143 reported for 1948.

In 1949 there were 209 plants engaged in this line of manufactures, including 115 in Ontario, 75 in Quebec, 10 in British Columbia, 4 in Manitoba, 2 in Saskatchewan, 2 in Yukon, and 1 in Alberta. The 186 works in the jewellery manufacturing division of this industry employed 3,559 to make goods worth \$19,708,364; the 16 silverware plants with 2,297 employees made products worth \$15,535,557, and the remaining 7 plants, which were occupied in recovering precious metals from scrap or in preparing gold and silver for use in the arts and industries, employed 359 people and had a combined output valued at \$15,513,539.

Altogether the 209 plants gave work to 6,215 people as against 5,810 persons working in 179 plants during 1948. Payments in salaries increased

to \$13,152,451 in 1949 from \$11,546,994 in the previous year.

Materials used in manufacturing processes, exclusive of fuel and electricity, cost of \$26,878,852 in 1949 as against \$22,254,331 in the previous year. Among the principal materials were gold and gold alloys, silver and silver alloys, nickel-silver, precious and semi-precious stones and jewellers' findings.

As reviewed in this bulletin, the jewellery and silverware industry includes all plants in Canada which made the following classes of goods as their main products: (a) rings and other jewellery; (b) sterling silverware and silver-plated ware; and (c) dental supplies, gold leaf, gold and silver melted or rolled or otherwise prepared for the arts and industries, and precious metals recovered from old materials, jewellers' sweepings and scrap. Wholesalers, retailers, or shops engaged only in repair work have not been included.
