THE JEWELLERY AND SILVERWARE INDUSTRY

1952

Manufacturers of jewellery, silverware and other precious metal products reported the value of their 1952 shipments at \$45,106,237, which was a decline of 10.5 per cent from the total of \$50,374,213 reported for 1951.

In 1952 there were 215 plants engaged in this line of manufacture, including 114 in Ontario, 80 in Quebec, 13 in British Columbia, 3 in Manitoba, 2 in Saskatchewan, 2 in Alberta and 1 in Yukon. The 194 works in the jewellery manufacturing division of this industry employed 3,478 people to make goods worth \$20,939,282; the 14 silverware plants with 1,684 employees made products worth \$12,660,830, and the remaining 7 plants, which were occupied in recovering precious metals from scrap or in preparing gold and silver for use in the arts and industries, employed 386 people and had a combined output valued at \$11,506,125.

Altogether the 215 plants gave work to 5,548 people as against 5,738 persons working in 209 plants during 1951. Payments in salaries increased to \$13,486,371 in 1952 from \$13,315,583 in the previous year.

Materials used in manufacturing processes, exclusive of fuel and electricity, cost \$22,612,299 in 1952 as against \$29,314,583 in the previous year. Among the principal materials were gold and gold alloys, silver and silver alloys, nickel-silver, precious and semi-precious stones and jewellers' findings.

As reviewed in this bulletin, the jewellery and silverware industry includes all plants in Canada which made the following classes of goods as their main products: (a) rings and other jewellery; (b) sterling silverware and silver-plated ware; and (c) dental supplies, gold leaf, gold and silver melted or rolled or otherwise prepared for the arts and industries; and precious metals recovered from old materials, jewellers' sweepings and scrap. Wholesalers, retailers, or shops engaged only in repair work have not been included.

Note: Data presented in this bulletin for 1952 under the heading of "Production" actually represent "Factory Shipments" and therefore, are not exactly comparable with previous years.
