

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ANNUAL INDUSTRY REPORTIRON AND STEEL AND THEIR PRODUCTS GROUPTHE WIRE AND WIRE GOODS INDUSTRY, 1941

This report presents statistics for the Wire and Wire Goods Industry which is a part of the iron and steel group and covers all establishments in Canada engaged chiefly in drawing iron and steel wire or in fabricating products from wire of iron or steel.

In 1941 the 82 factories in this industry were distributed by provinces as follows: Ontario, 50; Quebec, 20; British Columbia, 7; New Brunswick, 2; Nova Scotia 1; Manitoba 1 and Alberta 1.

Factory sales in 1941 were valued at \$42,335,022, including plain and galvanized wire, barbed wire, wire fencing, wire nails, tacks, staples, screws, wire cloth, wire rope, bale ties, upholstering springs and other such commodities. In 1940 factory sales were reported at \$32,448,393 and in 1939 at \$25,063,379.

The 13 wire drawing plants which operated in 1941 employed 2,995 workers, while the 69 establishments engaged only in the fabrication of wire goods had 3,401 workers. Sales from the wire drawing plants amounted to \$24,335,632 and from the fabricating plants to \$18,059,340.

The average number of employees in all plants in 1941 was 6,396, of which 4,332 worked in Ontario and 1,836 in Quebec. Payments to the 309 salaried employees totalled \$1,740,972 while the 5,587 wage-earners were paid \$7,366,533, a total for salaries and wages of \$9,107,560. In 1940 payments amounting to \$7,126,134 were made to 5,123 employees.

Capital employed at the end of the year was given at \$36,436,567, including the value of lands, buildings, and machinery at \$19,995,625; inventories at \$7,595,802; and cash, bills and accounts receivable, etc., at \$8,897,140. Works in Ontario accounted for 60 per cent of this investment and factories in Quebec for 26 per cent. In 1940 the total capital employed was given at \$32,939,491.


