

## THE WIRE AND WIRE GOODS INDUSTRY, 1945

This report presents statistics for the Wire and Wire Goods Industry which is a part of the iron and steel group and covers all establishments in Canada engaged chiefly in drawing iron and steel wire or in fabricating products from wire of iron or steel.

In 1945 the 89 factories in this industry were distributed by provinces as follows: Ontario, 52; Quebec, 23; British Columbia, 8; New Brunswick, 2; Nova Scotia 1; Manitoba, 2; and Alberta 1.

Factory sales in 1945 were valued at \$41,026,403 including plain and galvanized wire, barbed wire, wire fencing, wire nails, tacks, staples, screws, wire cloth, wire rope, bale ties, upholstering springs and other such commodities. In 1944 factory sales were reported at \$41,609,836 and in 1943 at \$41,117,308.

The 13 wire drawing plants which operated in 1945 employed 3,483 workers while the 76 establishments engaged only in the fabricating of wire goods had 2,675 workers. Sales from the wire drawing plants amounted to \$23,896,782 and from the fabricating plants to \$17,129,621.

The average number of employees in all plants in 1945 was 6,158 of whom 3,820 worked in Ontario and 1,544 in Quebec. Payments to the 882 salaried employees totalled \$2,056,099 while the 5,276 wage-earners were paid \$8,735,427, a total for salaries and wages of \$10,791,526. In 1944 payments amounting to \$11,449,592 were made to 6,575 employees.


