plants in Canada not classified to any of the main divisions provided for the firms manufacturing goods from non-ferrous metals, production was valued at \$1,116,053 in 1929. In the previous year output was reported at \$1,106,639 and in 1927 at \$947,705. This group includes firms which make metal weatherstripping of aluminium, copper, brass, etc., lamps and lanters for railway, marine, mine, and other uses, screens, camp and gasoline stoves, lamp and lantern burners, gas mantles, train order signals, cigarette rollers, headlights, etc.

Seventeen plants were classified in this industry in 1929; 13 were located in Onterio and 4 in Quebec. These firms reported a fixed and working capital of \$788,359 and employed a monthly average of 236 workers who received \$345,245 in salaries and wages. Their purchased materials cost \$317,130 and the value added by manufacturing processes was \$798,923.
