MANUFACTURES OF THE NON-FERROUS METALS

THE MISCELLANEOUS NON-FERROUS METAL PRODUCTS INDUSTRY, 1934.

The industry for which statistics are presented in this bulletin covers the operations of a miscellaneous group of concerns which could not properly be classified to any of the other industries included under the Manufactures of the Non-Ferrous Metals,

In 1934 only 20 plants were included in this group; 13 were located in Ontario, 5 in Quebec, and 2 in Manitoba. Production from these factories was valued at \$920,924, the number of employees was 291, payments for salaries and wages totalled \$312,863, and materials for manufacturing cost \$229,589.

Products included gasoline lamps, lanterns, camp stoves and irons, cigarette lighters, lamp and lantern burners, weatherstrip, fly screens, railway and marine lamps and lanterns, atomizers and perfume sprays, and spray painting equipment. The output of weatherstrip amounted to \$68,750 in 1934 compared with \$54,289 in 1933. Figures for other commodities cannot be published as there was only one or two producers in each case.
