MANUFACTURES OF THE NON-FERROUS METALS GROUP

## THE MISCFLLANEOUS NON-FEFFOUS METAL PFODUCTS INDUSTRY, 1939

The industry for which statistics are presented in this bulletin covers the operations of a miscellaneous group of concems which cannot properly be classified to any of the other industries included in the manufactures of the non-ferrous metals group.

In 1939 only 19 plants were included in this group, 15 being located in Ontario, 1 in Quebec, 2 in Menitoba and 1 in British Columbia. Production from these factories was valued at $\$ 1,940,415$, the number of employeos was 395 , payments for salaries and wages totalled $\$ 471,222$ and the cost of materials for use in manufacturing processes was $\$ 415,902$.

Production included gasoline lemps, lanterns, camp stoves and irons; weatherstrip, cigerette lighters, vacuum bottles, paint spraying equipment, atomizers and perfume sprays, railpay and marine lemps and lanterns, window screens, lamp and lanterm burners, name plates, etc. Output of weatherstrip amounted to $\$ 56,750$ in 1933 compared with $\$ 59,950$ in 1938. Figures for the other comadities cannot be published as there were only one or two producers in each case.
