## THE MISCELLANEOUS NON-FERROUS METAL PRODUCTS INDUSTRY, 1945

The industry for which statistics are presented in this bulletin covers the operations of a miscellaneous group of concerns which cannot properly be classified to any of the other industries included in the manufactures of the non-ferrous metals group.

In 1945 there were 27 plants included in this group, 19 being located in Ontario, 6 in Quebec, and 2 in Manitoba. Production from these factories was valued at \$6,866,252, the number of employees was 1,063, payments for salaries and wages totalled \$1,543,639, and the cost of materials for use in manufacturing processes was \$2,412,156.

Production included gasoline lamps, lanterns, camp stoves and irons; weatherstrip; cigarette lighters and flints for lighters; railway and marine lamps and lanterns; window screens; lamp and lantern burners; name plates, metallic packing, Stellite, etc. Output of weatherstrip amounted to \$56,859 in 1945 compared with \$55,691 in 1944. Figures for the other commodities cannot be published as there was only one or two producers in each case.
