THE MISCELLANEOUS NON-FERROUS METAL PRODUCTS INDUSTRY 1949

Note: There was not a separate report on this industry in 1947 or 1948.

The industry for which statistics are presented in this bulletin covers the operations of a miscellaneous group of concerns which cannot properly be classified to any of the other industries included in the manufactures of the non-ferrous metals group.

In 1949 there were 18 plants included in this group, 12 being located in Ontario, 3 in Manitoba, 2 in Quebec, and 1 in British Columbia. Production from these factories was valued at \$4,507,501, the number of employees was 686, payments for salaries and wages total-

led \$1,605,307 and the cost of materials for use in manufacturing processes was \$1,768,060.

Production included gasoline lamps, lanterns, camp stoves and irons; weatherstrip; railway and marine lamps and lanterns; window screens; lamp and lantern burners; name plates, metallic packing, Stellite, etc. Output of weatherstrip amounted to \$91,633 compared with \$98,444 in 1948. Figures for the other commodities cannot be published as there was only one or two producers in each case.
