# THE MISCELLANEOUS NON-FERROUS METAL PRODUCTS INDUSTRY 

## 1950

The industry for which statistics are presented in this bulletin covers the operations of a miscellaneous group of concerns which cannot properly be classified to any of the other industries included it tie manufactures of the non-ferrous metal group.

In 1950 there were 19 plants included in this (rouj, 11 being located in Ontario, 4 in Quebec, 3 in Manitoba and 1 in British Columbia. Production from these factories was valued at $\$ 3,885,437$; the number of employees was 595; payments for salaries and wages totalled $\$ 1,498,865$ and the cost of
materials for use in manufacturing processes was $\$ 1,235,327$.

Production included gasoline lamps, lanterns, camp stoves and irons, weatherstrip, railway and and marine lamps and lanterns, window screens, lamp and lantern burners, name plates, metallic packing, stellite, etc. Output of weatherstrip amounted to $\$ 189,198$, compared with $\$ 91.633$ in 1949. Figures for the other commodities cannot be published as there were only one or two producers in each case.
