# THE MISCELLANEOUS NON-FERROUS <br> METAL PRODUCTS INDUSTRY 

## 1952

The industry for which statistics are presented in this bulletin covers the operations of a miscellaneous group of concerns which cannot properly be classified to any of the other industries included in the manufactures of the non-ferrous metal group.

In 1952 there were 24 plants included in this group, 11 being located in Ontario, 9 in Quebec, 3 in Manitoba and 1 in British Columbia. Production from these factories was valued at $\$ 5,239,186$; the number of employees was 538; payments for salaries
and wages totalled $\$ 1,555,968$ and the cost of materials for use in manufacturing processes was \$2,123,585.

Production included electroplating supplies, weatherstrip, railway and marine lamps and lanterns, window screens, name plates, metallic packing, stellite, etc. Output of weatherstrip amounted to $\$ 251,568$ compared with $\$ 334,665$ in 1951. Figures for the other commodities cannot be published as there were only one or two producers in each case.
