THE MISCELLANEOUS NON-FERROUS METAL PRODUCTS INDUSTRY

1953

The industry for which statistics are presented in this bulletin covers the operations of a miscellaneous group of concerns which cannot properly be classified to any of the other industries included in the manufactures of the non-ferrous metal group.

In 1953 there were 21 plants included in this group, 8 being located in Ontario, 8 in Quebec, 3 in Manitoba and 2 in British Columbia. Factory shipments from these factories were valued at \$5,750,435; the number of employees was 560; payments for

salaries and wages totalled \$1,607,899 and the cost of materials for use in manufacturing processes was \$2,920,266.

Output included electroplating supplies, weatherstrip, railway and marine lamps and lanterns, window screens, name plates, metallic packing, stellite, etc. Output of weatherstrip amounted to \$309,011 compared with \$251,568 in 1952. Figures for the other commodities cannot be published as as there were only one or two producers in each case.
