The Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa reports that the production of gypsum in Canada during February amounted to 5,454 tons as compared with 5,762 tons produced in January and 19,162 tons in February, 1931.


The February production was obtained from quarries in Hants county, Nova Scotia; Albert county, New Brunswick; near Paris, Ontario; Gypsumville and Amaranth, Manitoba; and at Falkland, British Columbia.

No crude gypsum was exported from Canada during February; in the preceding month 60,009 tons were exported to the United States. Six tons of plaster of Paris valued at \$132 were shipped by Canadian producers to Great Britain and Barbados in February.

Plaster of Paris, not calcined, imported into Canada from Great Britain amounted to 30 tons worth \$402. Imports of calcined plaster of Paris declined to 29 tons appraised at \$1,025 as against 517 tons with a valuation of \$6,545 imported in January.
