## GYPSUM PRODUCTION IN CANADA, SEPTEMBER, 1932.

Canada produced 52,130 tons of gypsum in September as compared with 69,462 tons in the preceding month and 115,050 tons in September, 1931, according to a report just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. Production during the first nine months of 1932 totalled 338,611 tons, a decrease of 49.9 per cent from the tonnage produced in the corresponding period of the previous year.

Exports of crude gypsum from Canada declined 38.0 per cent to 45,740 tons from the August total of 73,750 tons. Plaster of Paris exportations were recorded at 57 tons valued at \$1,216 as against 29 tons at \$667 exported in August.

Canadian imports of plaster of Paris amounted to 65 tons with a valuation of \$1,217; in the previous month, 62 tons worth \$2,535 were imported. Imports of ground gypsum in September included 1 ton from Great Britain and 1 ton from the United States; in addition, 1 ton of crude gypsum (sulphate of lime) was received from the United States.
