GYPSUM PRODUCTION IN CANADA, MAY, 1933.

The Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa reports that the production of gypsum in Canada reached a total of 33,400 tons in May as compared with 4,241 tons in the preceding month and 32,242 tons in May, last year. The total Canadian gypsum output during the five months ending May, 1933, was 46,955 tons or 29.0 per cent below the production in the corresponding period of 1932.

Exports of crude gypsum in May amounted to 4,921 tons valued at \$7,800. No crude gypsum was exported during the preceding three months. Plaster of Paris exportations were recorded at 91 tons with a valuation of \$1,652 as against 21 tons at \$511 exported in April.

Canada imported 10 tons of plaster of Paris worth \$955 during May; in the previous month 63 tons at \$1,563 were imported. The United States supplied these tonnages. Customs' records show imports into Canada of one ton of crude gypsum and approximately three tons of ground gypsum in May.
