GYPSUM PRODUCTION IN C $\mathrm{C}_{2} \mathrm{~N}_{4} D_{4,}$ DECRMBER, 1934.

Gypsum production in Canade during Lecember smounted to 27,686 tons as compared with 66,572 tons in the preceding month and 31,035 tons in Lecember, 1933, according to a report just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Uttawa. During the calencar year 1934 the Canadian output totalled 457,634 tons or 18.6 per cent above the 1933 production of 382,736 tons.

Exports of crude gypsum from Canada in December reached a total of 55,742 tons; in November, 19,207 tons were exported. Seventy-three tons of plaster of Paris were exported during Lecember as against 65 tons in the preceding month.

Imports of plaster of Paris into Canada in December ware recorded at 72 tons worth 41,409 ; in November 25 tons appraised at 8858 were imported and during the calendar yoar, 551 tons at $\$ 15,890$ were received. Ground gypsum importations in Lecomber amounted to 1 ton with a valuation 01468 ; during the twelve months onding Dccomber, 173 tons valuod at $\% 4,838$ wero imported.
