CUAL AND COKE STATISTICS FOR CANADA, SEPTEMBER, 1933.

CUAL

Canadian mines produced 1,101,158 tons of coal in September as compared with 934,191 tons in the corresponding month of 1932 and 1,012,659 tons in September, 1931. The five-year average for the month was 1,204,659 tons. In September, 1933, the Canadian output included 750,811 tons of bituminous coal, 48,789 tons of subbituminous coal and 301,558 tons of lignite coal.

Nova Scotia's production in September totalled 497,888 tons; a year ago, 307,992 tons were produced. Alberta mines produced 408,775 tons or 5.2 per cent below the September, 1932, total of 431,252 tons. A 10.3 per cent falling-off was recorded in British Columbia's output; the month's total was 112,874 tons as against 125,834 tons in September, 1932. Saskatchewan produced 57,981 tons and New Brunswick, 25,640 tons as compared with the September, 1932, output of 51,719 tons and 17,392 tons, respectively.

Imports of coal into Canada totalled 1,468,108 tons, a decline of 15.8 per cent from the September, 1928-1932, average of 1,744,057 tons. In September, 1932, Canada imported 1,296,274 tons of coal. Anthracite importations were recorded at 379,999 tons made up of 208,318 tons from the United States, 171,679 tons from Great Britain, and 2 tons from Alaska. During the past six months Canada's anthracite requirements have been drawn from the following sources: Great Britain, 59.2 per cent and the United States, 40.8 per cent. Bituminous coal imports in September included 1,057,386 tons from the United States and 30,488 tons from Great Britain. Two hundred and thirty-five tons of lignite coal were imported from the United States in September.

Canadian coal exported from Canada in September amounted to 19,049 tons, a 66.4 per cent decline from the five-year average for the month of 56,668 tons. Clearances through Nova Scotia and New Brunswick ports were recorded at 11,714 tons and through the western ports, 7,335 tons.

Coal made available for consumption in Canada during the month was computed at 2,550,217 tons or 11.8 per cent below the 1928-1932 average for September of 2,892,048 tons. The September coal supply consisted of 379,999 tons of anthracite coal, 1,820,166 tons of bituminous coal, 48,789 tons of sub-bituminous coal and 301,263 tons of lignite coal.

Production of coke in Canada at 155,711 tons during September was the highest reported for any month since March, 1932, being 3.7 per cent over the 150,283 tons made in August, 1933, and 23 per cent greater than the 126,639 tons made in September of a year ago.

During the month 60,727 tons of Canadian coal and 151,561 tons of imported coal were carbonized in Canada to make 155,711 tons of coke. For the first nine months of this year oven charges included 386,948 tons of Canadian coal and 1,340,320 tons of imported coal while the aggregate output of coke amounted to 1,259,616 tons.

September totals included 12,854 tons of breeze of which 4,737 tons were made in the east, 7,430 tons in Ontario and 687 tons in the west. Sales of breeze totalled 6,156 tons including 5,051 tons by Ontario producers.
