COAL AND DUKE STATISTICS FOR CANADA, JANUARY, 1954.

COAL

Coal production in Canada during January totalled 1,270,567 tons or 22.3 per cent above the January, 1933, output of 1,038,528 tons but 4.3 per cent below the five year average for the month of 1,327,098 tons. The January, 1934, production was made up of 774,874 tons of bituminous coal, 57,029 tons of sub-bituminous coal and 438,664 tons of lignite coal.

Alberta was the leading producing province with an output of 533,793 tons; Nova Scotia followed with 430,493 tons. British Columbia's production of 150,716 tons was 21.9 per cent higher than the January, 1933, total. Saskatchewan mines produced 126,100 tons, a decrease of 3.0 per cent from the output in the corresponding month of 1933. An increase of 13.9 per cent was recorded in New Brunswick's production in January; the month's output was 29,065 tons as compared with 25,510 tons a year ago.

Imports of coal into Canada amounted to 542,551 tons; the January, 1933, total was 486,206 tons and the 1929-1933 average for the month was 845,523 tons. Receipts from the United States during the month included 171,847 tons of anthracite coal, 355,091 tons of bituminous coal and 596 tons of lignite coal. Importations from Great Britain consisted of 10,067 tons of anthracite coal and 4,950 tons of bituminous coal.

Canadian coal exports were recorded at 17,956 tons, a 52.7 per cent decline from the January, 1933, total and 66.7 per cent from the average for the month during the past five years. Clearances through Nova Scotia and New Brunswick ports totalled 4,941 tons, while Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Alberta and British Columbia ports cleared 12,015 tons.

Coal made available for consumption in Canada during January was computed at 1,795,162 tons, a 15.3 per cent decline from the January, 1929-1933, average of 2,118,666 tons. The January supply was obtained from the following sources: Canadian mines, 69.8 per cent; United States mines, 29.4 per cent, and Great Britain mines, 0.8 per cent.

COKE JANUARY, 1934.

Production of 194,957 tons of coke in Canada during January was the highest reported for any month since May, 1930 when 209,555 tons were made. This month's tonnage marked an improvement of 3 per cent over the 187,762 tons in December and 30 per cent over the 150,350 tons made in January of a year ago. Output in the eastern provinces advanced to 58,620 tons in January from 54,335 tons in December and in the western provinces to 18,949 tons from 15,894 tons while in Untario the output was little changed at 117,388 tons as against 117,533 tons in the previous month

During January 35,055 tone of Canadian coal and 188,991 tons of imported coal were carbonized to produce 194,957 tons of coke. Included in the January total were 16,306 tons of breeze of which 7,317 tons were from eastern ovens, 7,928 tons from Untario and 1,061 from the western provinces. Sales of breeze during January totalled 10,918 tons of which 7,837 tons were sold by Untario producers.
