COAL AND COKE STATISTICS FOR CANADA - NOVEMBER, 1934.

COAL

Canada produced 1,409,346 tons of coal in November, an increase of 4.6 per cent over the November, 1933, total of 1,346,878 tons and 3.8 per cent over the average for the month during the past five years of 1,357,313 tons. The November, 1934, output consisted of 924,520 tons of bituminous coal, 62,371 tons of sub-bituminous coal and 422,455 tons of lignite coal.

Nova Scotia's output was recorded at 593,683 tons or 15.4 per cent above the November, 1933, total of 514,464 tons. In Alberta, 534,379 tons were produced in November as compared with 535,564 tons, a year ago. The November, 1934, production from Alberta mines included 164,229 tons of bituminous coal, 62,371 tons of subbituminous coal and 307,779 tons of lignite coal; the November, 1933, output was made up of 169,278 tons of bituminous coal, 72,950 tons of sub-bituminous coal, and 293,336 tons of lignite coal. A decrease of 1.6 per cent was shown in British Columbia's coal production in November' as against the total for a year ago; the outputs were 135,485 tons and 137,642 tons, respectively. Mines in Saskatchewan produced 114,676 tons or 11.4 per cent below the tonnage mined a year ago. New Brunswick's production of coal advanced 6.9 per cent to 31,123 tons from the output in November, 1933.

Coal importations into Canada in November totalled 1,666,171 tons or 17.2 per cent above the imports in the corresponding month of 1933. The average for November during the past five years was 1,562,832 tons. Imports of anthracite coal into Canada in November reached a total of 450,066 tons made up of 228,357 tons from Great Britain, 185,382 tons from the United States, 30,671 tons from Germany and 5,656 tons from Belgium. Canada's anthracite supply during the eleven months ending November was obtained from the following sources: the United States, 49.2 per cent; Great Britain, 48.5 per cent; Germany, 1.8 per cent; Belgium, 0.5 per cent, and Newfoundland, the remainder. Bituminous coal receipts in November consisted of 1,159,748 tons from the United States, 55,670 tons from Great Britain, 280 tons from Norway, 24 tons from Newfoundland and 15 tons from Sweden. In November, 1933, the bituminous imports included 984,111 tons from the United States and 79,259 tons from Great Britain. Three hundred and sixty eight tons of lignite coal were received from the United States during November.

Exports of Canadian coal in November amounted to 29,634 tons; a year ago 26,135 tons were exported and the five-year average for the month was 43,701 tons. Nova Scotia and New Brunswick ports cleared 21,444 tons of Canadian coal in November while Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Alberta and British Columbia ports cleared 8,190 tons.

Canada's coal supply (computed on the basis of production plus imports less exports) totalled 3,045,883 tons as compared with the November, 1929-1933 average of 2,876,444 tons.

COKE

Production of coke in Canada averaged 6,585 tons a day in November, a decline of less than one per cent from this year's record which was established in October at 6,629 tons a day. The total output for November amounted to 198,861 tons as compared with 204,143 tons in the previous month and 174,236 tons in the corresponding month of a year ago.

Compared with the figures for October data for the month under review show that output in the Maritime provinces declined to 63,195 tons from 64,253 tons, in Ontario to 119,419 tons from 122,273 tons, and in the western provinces to 16,256 tons from 17,617 tons.

November totals included 9,899 tons of breeze of which 3,706 tons were made in eastern ovens, 5,198 tons in Ontario and 995 tons in the west. Sales of breeze totalled 6,052 tons, the Maritimes selling 3,622 tons and Ontario 2,305 tons.

For the first eleven months of this year the production of coke in Canada aggregated 2.069,952 tons while the corresponding figures for the first eleven months of 1933 amounted to 1,606,360 and in 1932 to 1,490,484 tons.
