COAL AND COKE STATISTICS FOR CANADA, APRIL, 1934.

CUAL

Canada's coal production in April reached a total of 807,930 tons, an increase of 20.5 per cent over the April, 1933, output but a 12.5 per cent falling off from the five-year average for the month of 923,607 tons. Bituminous coal production in April, 1934, amounted to 670,099 tons, sub-bituminous coal, 32,846 tons, and lignite coal, 104,985 tons.

Nova Scotia mines produced 401,273 tons or 49.5 per cent above the April, 1933, total of 268,447 tons. In Alberta 244,477 tons were mined as compared with 245,912 tons, a year ago. British Columbia's output rose 14.4 per cent to 110,165 tons from the April, 1933, total of 96,316 tons. A 6.3 per cent decline was recorded in Saskatchewan's production; the month's output was 32,749 tons as against 34,957 tons, a year ago. New Brunswick operators reported a production of 19,266 tons or 22.9 per cent below the total for the corresponding month in the preceding year.

Imports of coal into Canada in April declined 1.2 per cent to 574,309 tons from the April, 1929-1933, average of 581,490 tons. Anthracite coal importations totalled 85,323 tons, made up of 79,512 tons from the United States and 5,811 tons from Great Britain. Imports of bituminous coal amounted to 488,796 tons, of which the United States supplied 482,704 tons and Great Britain, 6,092 tons. Lignite receipts in April were recorded at 190 tons.

Canada exported 8,134 tons of coal in April, a 49.0 per cent decline from the average for the month during the past five years. Canadian coal exported through New Brunswick ports totalled 2,653 tons. Clearances through Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Alberta and British Columbia ports amounted to 5,481 tons.

During April coal made available for consumption in Canada totalled 1,374,105 tons, a 7.7 per cent decline from the average for April during the past five years. The April, 1934, supply was made up of 85,323 tons of anthracite coal, 1,150,825 tons of bituminous coal, 32,846 tons of sub-bituminous coal and 105,111 tons of lignite coal.

CUKE - APRIL, 1934.

Coke output in Canada during April amounted to 185,465 tons, a decline of about 3 per cent from the March production of 191,848 tons. In the eastern provinces the tonnage declined to 49,369 from 51,997, in Ontario to 120,745 from 121,918, and in the west to 15,351 from 17,933 tons. Production included 14,449 tons of breeze of which 8,777 tons were made in Ontario, 4,970 tons in the east and 702 tons in the west.

Sales of coke by the producers during April totalled 117,257 tons including 93,837 tons for domestic use and 23,420 tons for other purposes. In addition, the producing companies used 42,887 tons in their own smelters and 19,435 tons in their own coke or gas plants. Included in the sales were 8,076 tons of breeze - 4,033 tons in Ontario, 3,914 tons in the east and 129 tons in the west.

For the first four months of 1934 the cumulative production was 741,404 tons compared with 538,989 tons during the corresponding period of last year.

Imports of coke during April amounted to 20,251 tons; no coke was exported during the month. The apparent consumption of coke in Canada, as determined by adding imports to production, totalled 205,716 tons.
