## COAL AND COKE STATISTICS FOR CANADA - MAY, 1935.

## COAL

Canadian mines produced 920,736 tons of coal in May as against 1,004,944 tons a year ago and 883,489 tons, the average for the month during the past five years. The May, 1935, output consisted of 795,071 tons of bituminous coal, 32,703 tons of sub-bituminous coal and 92,962 tons of lignite coal.

Production from Nova Scotia mines in May totalled 496,735 tons; a decline of 17,1 per cent from the tonnage mined in the corresponding month of 1934. Alberta's output 266,463 tons was 7.7 per cent higher than the May, 1934 total. During the month under review Alberta's production included 169,186 tons of bituminous coal, 32,703 tons of subbituminous coal and 64,574 tons of lignite coal; the corresponding totals for May, 1934 were 163,335 tons, 28,501 tons and 55,503 tons. A decline of 3.5 per cent was recorded in British Columbia's output; the May, 1935 total was 103,838 tons and the May, 1934 production, 107,690 tons. Saskatchewan operators mined 28,388 tons as against 25,707 tons, a year ago. In New Brunswick, 25,212 tons were produced; in May, 1934 the output was 24,622 tons.

Canada imported 1,485,060 tons of coal in May; this represented a decline of 4,1 per cent from the tonnage brought into Canada a year ago. The 1930-1934 importations for the month averaged 1,218,316 tons. Receipts of anthracite coal in May consisted of 260,182 tons from Great Britain, 131,589 tons from the United States and 20,242 tons from Germany. Imports of bituminous coal were made up of 994,117 tons from the United States, 78,779 tons from Great Britain and 1 ton from Poland. One hundred and fifty tons of lignite coal were imported into Canada from the United States in May.

Exports of Canadian coal declined to 19,599 tons from the May, 1934 total of 23,763 tons. Exports in May during the past five years averaged 24,765 tons.

Coal made available for consumption in Canada during May totalled 2,386,197 tons as compared with 2,529,449 tons, a year ago and 2,077,041 tons, the five year average for the month.

## COKE

Production of by-product, bee-hive and gas-retort coke during May totalled 184,573 tons compared with 180,243 tons in the previous month and 185,171 tons in May of last year. Output in Ontario increased slightly to 111,910 tons in the current month from 111,195 tons in April and production from eastern plants advanced to 57,731 tons from 53,100 tons, but the tonnage made in the western provinces declined to 14,932 from 15,948.

The May output included 12,256 tons of breeze of which 5,807 tons were made in Ontario, 5,420 tons in the east and 1,029 tons in the west. Sales of breeze were reported by the producers as follows: Ontario, 5,529 tons; eastern provinces, 5,398 tons; western provinces, 624 tons.

During May the producers used 21,944 tons of coke in their own works, delivered 52,477 tons to associated smelters, and sold 43,306 tons for domestic use and 19,233 tons for other purposes. The tonnage sold for domestic use was 34 per cent lower than in April.

The cumulative production of coke for the year to date totalled 943,950 tons compared with 926,575 tons in the corresponding period of last year.

Imports of coke during May amounted to 42,285 tons and exports totalled 1,326 tons. In the five months ended May, 1935, the imports aggregated 134,821 tons compared with 239,887 tons during the corresponding months of last year. Exports totalled 9,180 tons for this year to date as against 332 tons for last year.
