GOAL AND COKE STATISTICS FOR CANADA - JUNE, 1935.

COAL

Coal production in Camada during June amounted to 925,114 tons as compared with 982,952 tons a year ago and 903,852 tons, the average for the month during the past five years. Production during June, 1935, included 808,396 tons of bituminous coal, 33,246 tons of sub-bituminous coal and 83,472 tons of lignite coal.

Nova Scotia mines produced 534,011 tons or 10.5 per cent below the output in June, 1934. An increase of 6.4 per cent was recorded in Alberta's output; the June, 1935, total was 255,057 tons as compared with 239,781 tons a year ago. During the month under review Alberta produced 160,609 tons of bituminous coal, 33,246 tons of sub-bituminous coal, and 61,202 tons of lignite coal; in June, 1934, the bituminous output totalled 161,694 tons, sub-bituminous, 30,056 tons, and lignite, 48,031 tons. British Columbia's production was 13.9 per cent lower at 93,045 tons; on the other hand, Saskatchewan's output rose 4.1 per cent to 22,270 tons. New Brunswick operators reported an output of 20,653 tons or 20.5 per cent above the total for the corresponding month of 1934. Seventy-eight tons of coal were produced in the Yukon during the month.

Imports of coal into Canada in June were recorded at 1,506,196 tons; a year ago, 1,532,375 tons were imported, while the average importations in June during the past five years was 1,339,681 tons. Anthracite coal receipts in June were made up of 187,513 tons from the United States, 156,072 tons from Great Britain, 22,898 tons from Germany and 7,202 tons from Belgium. The bituminous coal imports were drawn from the following sources: the United States, 1,111,413 tons; Great Britain, 20,933 tons; and Norway, 165 tons. No lignite coal was imported during June.

Canadian coal exports rose to 33,527 tons from the June, 1934, total of 22,370 tons and the June, 1930-1934, average of 30,945 tons.

Canada's coal supply in June was computed at 2,397,783 tons as compared with 2,492,957 tons a year ago and 2,212,568 tons, the five-year average for the month.

Production of 179,906 tons of coke in Canada during June represented an average output of 5,997 tons a day compared with a daily total of 5,954 tons in the previous month.and 4,518 tons per day in June of a year ago. A comparison by producing areas with data for May of this year shows that the tonnage made in the eastern provinces dropped slightly to 56,642 tons from 57,731 tons; for Ontario the total was 109,348 tons against 111,910 tons and for the western provinces, 13,916 tons against 14,932 tons.

THE TY HE

June totals included 12,118 tons of breeze of which 5,332 tons were made in the east, 5,913 tons in Ontario and 873 tons in the west. Sales of breeze amounted to 3,266 tons of which Ontario sold 1,194 tons and the eastern provinces, 1,963 tons.

For the six months ending June 30, 1935, the cumulative production of coke in Canada totalled 1,123,856 tons as compared with corresponding outputs of 1,105,880 tons and 808,810 tons during the first half of 1934 and 1933, respectively.
