COAL AND COKE STATISTICS FOR CANADA - AUGUST, 1935.

COAL

Canada's coal production in August totalled 975,932 tons as compared with 966,995 tons in July and 1,097,064 tons in August, 1934. The August, 1930-1934, average output was 919,640 tons. Production during August, 1935, consisted of 809,610 tons of bituminous coal, 14,705 tons of sub-bituminous coal, and 151,617 tons of lignite coal.

Nova Scotia mines produced 486,727 tons or 19.7 per cent below the August, 1934, total. Alberta operators reported an output of 339,483 tons as compared with 300,939 tons a year ago. The Alberta production during August, 1935, was made up of 206,827 tons of bituminous coal, 14,705 tons of sub-bituminous coal, and 117,951 tons of lignite coal; in the corresponding month of 1934 the output included 180,362 tons of bituminous coal, 15,886 tons of sub-bituminous coal, and 104,691 tons of lignite coal. A decline of 31.2 per cent was recorded in British Columbia's output in August; production during the month under review was 92,011 tons as against 133,790 tons a year ago. Saskatchewan produced 33,666 tons or 8.2 per cent above the tonnage mined in August, 1934. New Brunswick's production declined 3.8 per cent to 24,045 tons from the output during the corresponding month of 1934.

Imports of coal into Canada in August were recorded at 1,528,319 tons; a year ago, 1,462,469 tons were imported, while the average for the month during the past five years was 1,451,876 tons. The August anthracite coal importations were drawn from the following sources: Great Britain, 185,484 tons; the United States, 91,301 tons; Germany, 20,949 tons; Belgium, 8,389 tons, and French Indo-China, 8,062 tons. The Canadian imports of bituminous coal included 1,173,539 tons from the United States, 40,485 tons from Great Britain, 50 tons from Norway and 1 ton from Alaska. Fifty-nine tons of lignite coal were imported from the United States during August.

Canada exported 37,556 tons of coal in August as compared with 26,213 tons a year ago and 37,581 tons, the five year average for the month during the past five years.

Canada's coal supply (computed on the basis of production plus imports less exports) totalled 2,466,695 tons; the August, 1930-1934, average supply was 2,333,935 tons.

Production of 175,279 tons of coke in Canada during August marked a slight decline from the 176,291 tons of the previous month and compares with a corresponding total of 189,206 tons for August of a year ago. A comparison by producing areas with the data for July shows that output in the eastern provinces advanced to 57,726 tons from 54,790 tons but fell off in Ontario to 102,409 tons from 105,409 tons and in the western provinces to 15,144 tons from 16,092 tons.

August figures included 10,439 tons of breeze or 4,873 tons from eastern ovens, 4,699 tons from Ontario and 867 tons from the west. Of this total 3,321 tons were sold including 2,295 tons in the east and 773 tons in Ontario.

For the eight months ending August of this year the cumulative production of coke aggregated 1,475,426 tons, the corresponding totals for other years amounting to 1,478,573 tons in 1934 and 1,103,905 tons in 1933.
