MONTHLY REPORT

COAL AND COKE STATISTICS FOR CANADA - JUNE, 1936.

Coal production in Canada during June rose to 1,022,385 tons from the preceding month's total of 997,109 tons and the June, 1935 output of 930,093 tons. The output during the past five years averaged 859,458 tons. Production during June consisted of 924,206 tons of bituminous coal, 21,677 tons of sub bituminous coal and 76,502 tons of lignite coal.

An increase of 17.2 per cent was recorded in Nova Scotia's output in June; the month's production totalled 627,958 tons as compared with 535,841 tons, a year ago.

Alberta mines produced 223,744 tons made up of 152,058 tons of bituminous coal, 21,677 tons of sub-bituminous coal and 50,009 tons of lignite coal. In June, 1935, the Alberta production included 160,852 tons of bituminous coal, 32,652 tons of sub-bituminous coal and 61,752 tons of lignite coal. British Columbia operators reported an output of 123,245 tons or 32.5 per cent above the total for the corresponding month of 1935. Saskatchewan's production amounted to 26,493 tons as against 23,589 tons, a year ago. New Brunswick's output was lower at 20,685 tons.

Imports of coal into Canada in June advanced to 1,683,704 tons from the five-year average for the month of 1,263,421 tons. Anthracite coal importations included 227,835 tons from Great Britain, 163,630 tons from the United States, 31,942 tons from Germany, 17,566 tons from French Indo-China, and 8,175 tons from Belgium. Bituminous coal imports consisted of 1,217,789 tons from the United States, 16,558 tons from Great Britain and 209 tons from Norway.

Canada exported 32,639 tons of coal in June; a year ago, 33,527 tons were exported while the average exports for the month during the past five years was 23,978 tons.

The Canadian coal supply during the month (made up from the production plus imports less exports) was computed at 2,673,450 tons or 11.3 per cent above the tonnagemade available in June, 1935

COKE

Production of coke from bee hive and by-product ovens and from gas retorts totalled 198,953 tons during June compared with last month's output of 200,122 tons and 179,906 tons in June of a year ago.

Output in the month under review included 11,777 tons of breeze of which 5,071 tons were sold. In the eastern provinces 5,710 tons of breeze were produced and 3,656 tons were sold; in Ontario, 5,390 tons were made and 1,129 tons sold, while in the western provinces 677 tons were made and 286 tons were sold.
