MONTHLY REPORT

COAL AND COKE STATISTICS FOR CANADA - MAY, 1937.

Canada's coal production during May advanced to 1,075,605 tons from the previous month's total of 973,142 tons and the May, 1936, output of 998,447 tons. The average May production during the past five years was 861,157 tons. The May, 1937, output included 970,551 tons of bituminous coal, 22,204 tons of sub-bituminous coal, and 82,850 tons of lignite coal.

Nova Scotia operators mined 639,270 tons of coal in May as compared with 461,900 tons in April and 571,892 tons in May, 1936. Production from Alberta mines totalled 275,928 tons made up of 194,246 tons of bituminous coal, 22,204 tons of sub-bituminous coal, and 59,478 tons of lignite coal. During May, 1936, Alberta produced 173,487 tons of bituminous coal, 27,165 tons of sub-bituminous coal, and 52,672 tons of lignite coal. British Columbia's production was 110,878 tons as against 119,172 tons a year ago. New Brunswick operators reported an output of 26,073 tons or one per cent below the May, 1936, total of 26,329 tons. A decline of 15.8 per cent was recorded in Saskatchewan's output; during the month under review, 23,372 tons were produced while a year ago 27,765 tons were mined.

Imports of coal into Canada in May amounted to 1,702,528 tons; in the corresponding month of 1936 imports totalled 1,361,598 tons while the May 1932-1936 average was 1,274,929 tons. Anthracite coal importations were made up of 221,042 tons from the United States, 124,198 tons from Great Britain, 14,186 tons from Russia and 10,535 tons from Germany. Receipts of bituminous coal included 1,331,358 tons from the United States, 1,109 tons from Germany, 52 tons from Great Britain and 8 tons from Norway. Forty tons of lignite coal were imported from the United States in May.

Canadian coal exported in May declined to 19,215 tons from the May, 1936, exports of 23,664 tons and the five-year average for the month of 20,061 tons.

The Canadian coal supply during May (computed on the basis of production plus imports less exports) totalled 2,758,918 tons. In May, a year ago, 2,336,381 tons were made available for use while the average yearly supply during the period 1932-1936 was 2,116,025 tons.

COKE

Production of coke during May amounted to 218,206 tons compared with 214,014 tons in April and 200,122 tons in May of 1936. For the first five months of this year, 492,578 tons of Canadian coal and 999,158 tons of imported coal were carbonized to produce 1,069,146 tons of coke. Production figures for the corresponding months of other years were 1,002,185 tons in 1936 and 943,950 tons in 1935.

May figures included 12,747 tons of breeze of which 4,413 tons were sold for domestic or other uses. Breeze production by areas follows: - Eastern provinces, 6,332 tons; Ontario, 5,339 tons, and the Western provinces, 1,076 tons.
