MONTHLY REPORT

COAL AND COKE STATISTICS FOR CANADA - AUGUST, 1937.

The Canadian production of coal in August advanced to 1,222,976 tons from the preceding month's total of 1,139,840 tons and the August, 1936, output of 1,056,032 tons. The average production for the month during the past five years was 952,571 tons. During August, bituminous coal output totalled 1,031,866 tons; sub-bituminous coal, 37,551 tons, and lignite coal, 153,559 tons.

Nova Scotia mines produced 691,321 tons as compared with 565,859 tons a year ago. Operators in Alberta reported an output of 350,416 tons, consisting of 184,790 tons of bituminous coal, 37,551 tons of sub-bituminous coal, and 128,075 tons of lignite coal. In August, 1936, Alberta's production included 177,538 tons of bituminous coal, 33,875 tons of sub-bituminous coal, and 107,925 tons of lignite coal. An advance of 10.8 per cent was recorded in British Columbia's output as against the output a year ago; the totals were 130,010 tons and 117,328 tons, respectively. Saskatchewan mines produced 25,484 tons or 16.5 per cent below the production a year ago. In New Brunswick, 25,745 tons were mined during August; in the corresponding month of 1936 the mines in this province produced 22,981 tons.

Canada imported 1,776,400 tons of coal in August; a year ago, 1,539,189 tons were imported while the five-year average for the month was 1,405,687 tons. Receipts of anthracite coal in August totalled 321,382 tons and consisted of 138,760 tons from Great Britain, 98,810 tons from the United States, 42,190 tons from Russia, and 41,622 tons from Germany. Imports of bituminous coal amounted to 1,454,972 tons, of which 1,449,029 tons came from the United States, 5,782 tons from Great Britain, 131 tons from Germany, and 30 tons from Norway.

Exports of Canadian coal were recorded at 32,105 tons as compared with 33,689 tons in August, 1936, and 28,675 tons, the August, 1932-1935, average.

Coal made available for consumption in Canada during August amounted to 2,967,271 tons; the average quantity made available in August, during the past five years, was 2,329,583 tons.

Production of coke in Canada during August totalled 214,408 tons compared with 211,569 tons for last month and 190,853 tons in August, 1936. During the first eigh months of this year, 771,454 tons of Canadian coal and 1,602,501 tons of imported coal were carbonized to produce 1,705,046 tons of coke. Production figures for the corresponding period of other years amounted to 1,585,255 tons in 1936, 1,475,426 tons in 1935, and 1,478,573 tons in 1934.

August figures included 12,978 tons of breeze of which 3,601 tons were Breeze production by areas was as follows - Maritimes, 6,978 tons; sold. Ontario, 4,896 tons, and Western Provinces, 1,104 tons.
