MONTHLY REPORT

COAL AND COKE STATISTICS FOR CANADA - FEBRUARY, 1938.

Canada produced 1,387,030 tons of coal during February as compared with 1,284,741 tons produced in February, 1937 and 1,171,108 tons, the five-year average for the month. The February output included 893,336 tons of bituminous coal, 61,330 tons of sub-bituminous coal and 432,364 tons of lignite coal.

Alberta mines produced 580,948 tons made up of 211,332 tons of bituminous coal, 61,330 tons of sub-bituminous coal and 308,286 tons of lignite coal. During February, a year ago, 194,794 tons of bituminous coal, 50,430 tons of sub-bituminous coal and 296,435 tons of lignite coal were produced. Nova Scotia operators reported an output of 530,072 tons as against 453,477 tons, a year ago. British Columbia mined 125,387 tons or 5.9 per cent below the total for the corresponding month of 1937. Production from Saskatchewan sources totalled 124,078 tons; in February, 1937 the output was 115,006 tons. New Brunswick's output amounted to 26,545 tons as against 41,322 tons, a year ago.

Imports of coal into Canada during the month under review totalled 440,958 tons; in the corresponding month of 1937, imports amounted to 486,528 tons. The February, 1933-1937 average was 477,436 tons. Receipts of anthracite coal in February included 161,173 tons from the United States and 11,438 tons from Great Britain. Bituminous imports consisted of 261,221 tons from the United States and 6,920 tons from Great Britain. Two hundred and six tons of lignite coal were imported from the United States during the month.

Exports of Canadian coal in February were recorded at 32,667 tons; in the corresponding month of last year 27,253 tons were exported while the average for the month during the past five years was 28,503 tons.

Canada's coal supply in February (computed on the basis of production plus imports less exports) was 1,795,321 tons, a year ago 1,744,401 tons were made available for consumption.

COKE - FEBRUARY, 1938.

Production of coke in Canada during February, a short month, amounted to 199,340 tons, or an average of 7,119 tons a day. The daily rate in January was reported at 7,223 tons, and in February of a year ago, at 7,074 tons a day.

During the month 92,617 tons of Canadian coal and 186,100 tons of imported coal were carbonized to produce 199,340 tons of coke, making a total output for the year to date of 423,248 tons. The corresponding total for the first two months of 1937 was 415,887 tons.

Included in the February figures were 11,926 tons of breeze, of which 5,749 tons were sold for domestic and other uses. Of the total breeze made, 5994 tons were accounted for by eastern producers whose sales amounted to 3,062 tons, Ontario ovens produced 4,890 and sold 651 tons, while the west reported 1,042 tons made and 2,036 tons sold.

Sales of manufactured gas in Canada during January, 1938 totalled 1,394,190 M cubic feet.
