MONTHLY REPORT

COAL AND COKE STATISTICS FOR CANADA - APRIL, 1938.

The Canadian output of coal during April amounted to 869,772 tons compared with 988,823 tons a year ago and the five-year average for the month of 861,021 tons. Production during April consisted of 712,774 tons of bituminous coal, 34,261 tons of sub-bituminous coal and 122,737 tons of lignite coal.

Nova Scotia operators reported an output of 397,689 tons of coal; in April a year ago, 467,437 tons were produced. Output from Alberta mines declined to 288,141 tons from the tonnage mined in April, 1937 and included 171,596 tons of bituminous coal, 34,261 tons of sub-bituminous coal and 82,284 tons of lignite coal. In April, 1937 the Alberta production was made up of 192,831 tons of bituminous coal, 31,043 tons of sub-bituminous coal and 80,774 tons of lignite coal. A decline of 18.7 per cent was recorded in British Columbia's output when 111,206 tons were produced compared with 136,833 tons produced a year ago. Saskatchewan's output amounted to 40,453 tons as against 45,661 tons in April, 1937. New Brunswick mines produced 32,283 tons; a year ago, 34,244 tons were produced.

Imports of coal into Canada in April were recorded at 545,287 tons compared with 916,062 tons in the corresponding month of 1937 and the April, 1933-1937 average of 588,617 tons. Receipts of anthracite coal during the month were made up of 110,502 tons from the United States and 35,316 tons from Great Britian. Bituminous coal importations included 394,060 tons from the United States and 5,327 tons from Great Britain. Eighty-two tons of lignite coal were imported from the United States in April.

Canada exported 12,538 tons of coal in April, a year ago 14,065 tons were exported while exports during the past five years averaged 11,639 tons.

The Canadian coal supply computed on the basis of production plus imports less exports amounted to 1,402,521 tons in April compared with 1,890,820 tons a year ago.

COKE - APRIL, 1938,

Production of coke in Canada during April amounted to 207,755 tons, a drop of 5 per cent from the March total of 218,233 tons and 3 per cent below the 214,014 tons reported for April, 1937. All producing areas participated in the decline, the tonnage made in the eastern provinces dropping to 70,369 from 73,396, in Ontario to 118,378 from 123,792 and in the western provinces to 19,008 from 21,045.

Oven charges for the four months ending April included 398,541 tons of Canadian coal and 788,724 tons of imported coal. From these charges 849,236 tons of coke were produced as against 850,940 tons during the first four months of a year ago.

The April production figures included 11,956 tons of breeze of which 3,930 tons were sold. In the eastern provinces 5,751 tons were made and 2,725 tons were sold; in Ontario output was 4,866 tons and 615 tons were sold, while in the western provinces 1,339 tons were made and 590 tons sold.
