## MONTHLY REPORT

## COAL AND COKE STATISTICS FOR CANADA - MAY, 1938.

Canadian coal mines produced 1 017,337 tons of coal during May compared with 1,077,669 tons a year ago and the five year average for the month of 937,399 tons. The May output included 911,418 tons of bituminous coal, 8,197 tons of subbituminous coal, and 97,722 tons of lignite coal.

Production from Nova Scotia mines amounted to 609,098 tons; in May, a year ago, 638,941 tons were produced. Alberta's output totalled 252,466 tons and consisted of 175,975 tons of bituminous coal, 8,197 tons of sub-bituminous coal and 68,294 tons of lignite coal. During May, 1937, Alberta's production was made up of 194,194 tons of bituminous coal, 21,520 tons of sub-bituminous coal and 57.511 tons of lignite coal. A decline of 8.5 per cent was shown in British Columbia's output when 104,425 tons were mined compared with 114,070 tons a year ago. An increase of 25 per cent was recorded in Saskatchewan's production; the May total was 29,428 tons as against 23,538 tons in the corresponding month of 1937. New Brunswick operators reported an output of 21,920 tons; a year ago, 27,811 tons were mined.

Customs' records show that Canada imported 1,351,193 tons of coal during the month under review; in May, 1937, imports were higher at 1,702,528 tons. Importations during May, 1933-1937, averaged 1,407,458 tons. Anthracite receipts in May amounted to 420,934 tons and consisted of 185,191 tons from the United States, 166,802 tons from Great Britain, 65,819 tons from Germany, and 3,122 tons from Morocco. Imports of bituminous coal were made up of 923,008 tons from the United States and 7,239 tons from Great Britain. Twelve tons of lignite coal were imported from the United States during the month.

Exports of Canadian coal in May rose to 22,092 tons from the total of 19,215 tons for the corresponding month of 1937. During the past five years exports for the month averaged 20,250 tons.

Coal made available for consumption in Canada during May totalled 2,346,438 tons compared with 2,760,982 tons, a year ago.

Production of coke in Canada at 207,712 tons in May compares with 207,755 tons in the previous month and 218,206 tons in May of last year. Compared with the April figures, May showed an advance to 71,303 tons from 70,369 tons in the Eastern Provinces, while in Ontario output fell off slightly to 118,007 tons from 118,378 tons and in the Western Provinces to 18,402 tons from 19,008 tons.

Oven charges for the first five months of this year included 495,787 tons of Canadian coal and 980,705 tons of imported coal, all of which was carbonized to produce 1,056,948 tons of coke. During the corresponding period of last year output amounted to 1,069,146 tons.

May production figures included 11,007 tons of breeze of which 2,077 tons were sold. Of these totals, the Eastern Provinces made 4,659 tons and sold 1,229 tons, Ontario made 4,890 tons and sold 669 tons and the Western Provinces made 1,458 tons of which 179 tons were sold.
