MONTHLY REPORT

COAL AND COKE STATISTICS FOR CANADA - AUGUST, 1938.

Canadian coal mines produced 992,668 tons of coal in August; during the preceding month 814,910 tons were produced while in August, 1937, the output totalled 1,241,948 tons. The production of bituminous coal in August amounted to 816,956 tons, of sub-bituminous coal, 15,635 tons, and of lignite coal, 160,077 tons.

Operators in Nova Scotia reported an output of 470,164 tons compared with 698,983 tons a year ago. Alberta produced 338,171 tons made up of 207,887 tons of bituminous coal, 15,635 tons of sub-bituminous coal, and 114,649 tons of lignite coal. In August, 1937, this province produced 185,451 tons of bituminous coal, 37,370 tons of sub-bituminous coal, and 128,702 tons of lignite coal. Production in British Columbia declined 9 per cent to 118,232 tons from the tonnage mined a year ago. An increase of 50.7 per cent was recorded in Saskatchewan's output; during the month under review, 45,428 tons were produced as against,30,139 tons in August, 1937. New Brunswick produced 20,673 tons; a year ago, 31,260 tons were produced.

Imports of coal into Canada in August were 17.6 per cent lower at 1,463,919 tons compared with 1,776,998 tons in the corresponding month of 1937. Receipts of anthracite coal totalled 333,444 tons and consisted of 142,369 tons from Great Britain, 118,584 tons from the United States, 48,931 tons from Germany, 9,790 tons from French Indo-China, 8,870 tons from Belgium and 4,900 tons from Morocco. Importations of bituminous coal included 1,116,122 tons from the United States, 12,318 tons from Great Britain, and 2,022 tons from Germany. Thirteen tons of lignite coal were received from the United States during the month.

Exports of Canadian coal amounted to 34,522 tons; the August, 1937, exports were lower at 32,105 tons.

Canada's coal supply (computed on the basis of production plus imports less exports) in August totalled 2,422,065 tons compared with 2,986,841 tons a year ago.

COKE - AUGUST, 1938.

Production of coke in Canada amounted to 182,368 tons in August compared with 183,199 tons made in the previous month and 214,408 tons in August of a year ago. Tonnage in the eastern provinces declined to 55,106 tons from 57,393 tons, this drop being more than enough to offset the slight advance in the western provinces to 18,130 tons from 16,991 tons and in Ontario to 109,132 tons from 108,815 tons.

Coke oven charges during the first eight months of this year included 733,183 tons of Canadian coal and 1,516,952 tons of imported coal or a total of 2,250,135 tons from which 1,614,427 tons of coke were produced. During the corresponding period of last year the coke output totalled 1,705,046 tons.

August production figures included 10,807 tons of breeze of which 2,710 tons were sold. Of these totals the eastern provinces made 5,710 tons and sold 2,046 tons, Ontario made 3,905 tons and sold 481 tons, and the western provinces produced 1,192 tons and sold 183 tons.
