COAL AND COKE STATISTICS FOR CANADA - OCTOBER, 1939

Coal production in Canada during October rose to 1,747,663 tons from the October 1938 output of 1,503,608 tons and the five-year average for the month of 1.629.149 tons. The October, 1939 production consisted of 1,122,662 tons of bituminous coal, 70,571 tons of sub-bituminous coal and 554,430 tons of lignite coal.

Nova Scotia mines produced 715,950 tons compared with 570,368 tons, a year ago. Alberta's output totalled 758,622 tons and consisted of 242,013 tons of bituminous coal, 70,571 tons of sub-bituminous coal and 446,038 tons of lignite coal. In October, 1938, Alberta produced 207,392 tons of bituminous coal, 53,022 tons of subbituminous coal and 386,644 tons of lignite coal. Production in British Columbia advanced to 129,232 tons; a year ago, 121,263 tons were produced. Saskatchewan mined 108,392 tons or 19.5 per cent below the tonnage produced in October, 1938. An increase of 18.1 per cent was recorded in the New Brunswick output; the month's total was 35,467 tons as against 30,028 tons mined, a year ago.

Canada imported 1,949,633 tons of coal in October; this was 24.9 per cent higher than the October, 1934-1938 average. Anthracite importations included 351,133 tons from the United States, 94,836 tons from Great Britain, 25,972 tons from French Indo-China and 3,934 tons from Germany. Receipts of bituminous coal were made up of 1.470.592 tons from the United States and 2,796 tons from Great Britain. Lignite coal imports consisted of 343 tons from the United States and 27 tons from Alaska.

Exports of Canadian coal amounted to 42,053 tons as against 25,826 tons in October, 1938 and 37,589 tons, the five-year average for the month. During the first ten months of the current year 305, 279 tons were exported.

Canada's coal supply in October was computed at 3,655,243 tons; a year ago, 2,935,263 tons were made available for use.

COKE - OCTOBER, 1939

Production of 226,614 tons of coke in Canada during October was the highest output reported for any month since May of 1929 when the total was 230,739 tons. It exceeded by 22 per cent the 186,284 tons made in the previous month and was 23 per cent above the 184,334 tons for the corresponding month a year ago.

Included in the October figures were 12,295 tons of breeze of which 4,148 tons were sold. The Eastern provinces made 5,786 tons and sold 1,630 tons. Ontario made 5,379 tons and sold 2,029 tons, and the western provinces made 1,130 tons and sold 489 tons.

During the first ten months of this year 889,573 tons of Canadian coal and 1,780,096 tons of imported coal were carbonized in Canada's coke ovens and gas retorts to produce 1,915,688 tons of coke. During the ten months ending October, 1938 output was reported at 1,982,928 tons.
