## MONTH REPORT



## COAL AND COKE STATISTICS FOR CANADA - MARCH, 1939.

The Canadian output of coal in March amounted to $1,160,964$ tons; in the preceding month, 1,290,383 tons were produced while in March, 1938, the production totalled $1,819,054$ tons. The average output for the month during the past five years was 1,085,653 tons. During March, bituminous cos production was recorded at 851,892 tons, sub-bituminous coal at 45,452 tons, and lignite coal at 263,620 tons.

Alberta operators reported an output of 430,417 tons made up of 209,382 tons of bituminous coal, 45,452 tons of sub-bituminous coal, and 175,593 tons of lignite coal. A year ago Alberta produced 238,235 tons of bituminous coal, 86,241 tons of sub-bituminous coal, and 136,838 tons of lignite coal. Production from Note Scotia mines declined to 474,030 tons from the March, 1938, total of 528,559 tons. Mines in British Columbia reported an output of 125,331 tons compared with 129,001 tons a year ago. Saskatchewan's production mas 38.1 per cent higher at 88,037 tons. New Brunswick operators mined 43,149 tons as against 36,232 tons in March, 1938.

Imports of coal into Canada were recorded at 538,554 tons in March or 8.2 per cent above the importations a year ago but 5.9 per cent below the five-year average for the month of 572,165 tons. Receipts of anthracite coal amounted to 214,127 tons and consisted of 201, 455 tons from the United States, 10,432 tons from Great Britain, and 2,240 tons from Germany. Imports of bituminous coal were made up of 314,934 tons from the United States and 9,339 tons from Great Britain. One hundred and fifty-four tons of lignite coal were received from the United States in March.

Canada exported 31,328 tons of coal during the month under review compared with 28,012 tons a year ago and the March, 1934-1938, average of 30,537 tons.

Coal made available for consumption in Canada during March advanced 1.2 per cent to $1,668,190$ tons from the tonnage made available a year ago.

## COKE - MARCH, 1939.

Production of coke in Canada during March, when compared with February, a short month, showed a decline in the daily rate of almost 1 per cent. Outnut in March amounted to 187,785 tons against 176,537 tons in February and 218,233 tons in March, 1938.

During the first three months of this year a total of 238,062 tons of Canadian coal and 545,033 tons of imported coal vere carbonized in Canada to produce 566,750 tons of coke. Output for the first quarter of a year ago was reported at 641,481 tons.

March figures include a production of breeze amounting to 11,667 tons of which 3,969 tons were sold. In the east the outnut of breeze totalled 5,339 tons with sales of 2,354 tons; in Ontario there was a production of 5,096 tons with sales of 956 tons, and in the west, 1,23 ? tons were made and 659 tons sold.
