## MONTHLY REPORT

COAL AND COKE STATISTICS FOR CANADA - JULY, 1939.

Canadian mines produced 1,064,354 tons of coal in July compared with 825,940 tons a year ago and $1,001,673$ tons, the five-year average for the month. Bituminous coal output during the month under review totalled 982,221 tons, subbiturinous coal, 8,776 tons, and lignite coal, 73,357 tons.

Production from Nova Scotia mines amounted to 621,529 tons, or 32.3 per cent above the July, 1938, total. Alberta produced 256,525 tons made up of 199,077 tons of bituminous coal, 8,776 tons of sub-bituminous coal, and 48,672 tons of lignite coal. In July, 1938, Alberta mined 154,535 tons of bituninous coal, 11,166 tons of sub-bituminous coal, and 49,117 tons of lignite coal. An increase of 8.4 per cent was recorded in the output of coal from British Columbia mines; during the month under review, 133,351 tons were produced as against 96,363 tons a year ago. New Brunswick operators reported an output of 28,264 tons which was 40.9 per cent above the production in July, 1938. Saskatchewan mined 24,685 tons; a year ago, 24,907 tons vere produced.

Imports of coal into Canada in July rose to $1,590,973$ tons or 7.5 per cent higher than the recoipts a year ago. Anthracite importations consisted of 192,774 tons from Great Britain, 184,416 tons from the United States, 69,068 tons from Germany, and 8,727 tons from French Indo-China. Bituminous coal imports included $1,128,733$ tons from the United States and 7,150 tons from Great Britein.

Exports of Canadian coal declined to 18,627 tons from the July, 1938, total of 20,022 tons. The average quantity of coal exported in July during the past five years was 26,748 tons.

Canada's coal supply (computed on the basis of output plus imports less exports) totalled 2,636,700 tons in July compared with 2,285,987 tons a year ago.

COKE - JULY. 1939.
Coke production in Canada amounted to 189,254 tons in July compared with 187,990 tons in June and 183,199 tons in the corresponding month of a year ago. Output in the eastern provinces advanced slightly to 69,349 tons in July from 67,069 tons in June and remained steady in Ontario at 10Z,222 tons against 103,159 tons while production in the western provinces fell off to 16,683 tons from 17,762 tons.

This month s output included 11,870 tons of breeze of which 8,346 tons were sold. In the east, 5,272 tons were made and 1,051 tons sold; Ontario made 4,845 tons and sold 7,004 tons, and the west produced 1,753 tons and sold 291 tons.

During the first seven months of this jear the qumulative production of coke was $1,312,067$ tons against a total of $1,432,057$ tons for the corresponding period in 1938.
