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MONTHLY REPORT

COAL AND COKE STATISTICS FOR CANADA - DECEMBER, 1940

During December, Canadian coal mines produced 1,643,092 tons; a year ago, 1,485,826 tons were produced while the five year average for the month was 1,446,830 tons. The production of bituminous coal in December amounted to 1,065,405 tons of sub-bituminous coal, 81,634 tons and of lignite coal, 496,053 tons.

Alberta operators mined 685,000 tons of coal in December, made up of 268,-945 tons of bituminous coal, 81,634 tons of sub-bituminous coal and, 334,421 tons of lignite coal. In december, 1939 Alberta's production consisted of 249,644 tons of bituminous coal, 53,094 tons of sub-bituminous coal and, 236,280 tons of lignite coal. Nova Scotia mines produced 614,919 tons compared with 634,790 tons, a year ago. Saskatchewan producers reported an output of 161,632 tons as against 113,130 tons in December, 1939. The output from British Columbia mines totalled 139,685 tons; in December, 1939, this province produced 158,833 tons. Mines in New Brunswick produced 41,856 tons; in the corresponding month of 1939 production was lower at 39,717 tons.

Imports of coal into Canada in December aggregated 842,407 tons compared with 1,157,869 tons, a year ago and 943,080 tons, the December 1935-1939 average. Importations during the month under review included 218,667 tons of anthracite coal, 623,425 tons of bituminous coal and, 315 tons of lignite coal.

Exports of Canadian coal rose to 46,885 tons from the December, 1939 total of 41,400 tons and, the average of 40,745 tons for the month during the past five years.

Canada's coal supply (based on production plus imports less exports) was computed at 2,438,614 tons in December; a year ago 2,602,295 tons were made available for use.

COKE - DECEMBER - 1940

Production of by-product and gas house coke in Canada averaged 8,623 tons a day in December when the total was 267,311 tons. This average compares with 8,609 tons a day in November of this year and 7,856 tons a day in December of a year ago.

During the current month 135,464 tons of Canadian coal and 235,713 tons of imported coal were charged to coke ovens to make a total charge for the year of 1,496,—310 tons of Canadian coal and 2,702,005 tons of imported coal. From the carbonization of this coal 3,015557 tons of coke were produced. Corresponding coke production figures for other years were as follows: 2,410,095 tons in 1939; 2,352,003 tons in 1938 and 2,570,385 tons in 1937.

Stocks of coke (made from coal) in the hands of the producers on December 31, 1940, amounted to 288,470 tons of which 184,220 tons were located in Ontario, 70,-144 tons in the east and 34,106 tons in the west.

In addition to the above Canadian oil refineries produced 66,820 tons of petroleum coke during 1940 and only 333 tons of this coke were reported in stock at the refineries at the end of the year.
