MONTHLY REPORT

COAL AND COKE STATISTICS FOR CANADA - AUGUST, 1940

Coal production in Canada during August was recorded at 1,357,948 tons; a year ago, 1,285,424 tons were produced while the five year average for the month was 1,116,830 tons. Bituminous coal output in August totalled 1,140,444 tons, subbituminous coal, 48,489 tons and lignite coal, 169,015 tons.

Production from Nova Scotia mines rose to 678,059 tons from the total of 630,622 tons in the corresponding month of 1939. Alberta's output totalled 443,561 tons, made up of 261,482 tons of bituminous coal, 48,489 tons of sub-bituminous coal and 133,590 tons of lignite coal. In August, 1939, Alberta produced 271,045 tons of bituminous coal, 31,347 tons of sub-bituminous coal and 107,450 tons of lignite coal. British Columbia operators mined 162,451 tons of coal in August as against 172,408 tons, a year ago. Mines in New Brunswick produced 38,452 tons of coal during the month; in August, 1939, these mines produced 34,523 tons. Saskatchewan's output amounted to 35,425 tons or 6.8 per cent below the production in the corresponding month of 1939.

Imports of coal into Canada in August aggregated 2,298,531 tons compared with 1,628,296 tons a year ago and, the 1935-39 average for the month of 1,583,201 tons. Receipts of anthractte coal totalled 439,989 tons and of bituminous coal, 1,858,542 tons.

Canada exported 36,420 tons of coal during August; a year ago, 25,042 tons were exported. Exports during August 1935-1939 averaged 32,583 tons.

COKE - AUGUST - 1940.

Production of coke from coal in Canada during August amounted to 256,977 tons compared with 258,411 tons in the previous month and 190,723 in August, 1939. In Quebec and the Maritimes, the output dropped to 88,213 tons from 89,524 tons and in the western provinces to 19,184 tons 19,541 tons, but in Onta rio the tonnage advanced slightly to 149,580 from 149,346 tons in July.

The August figure included 16,030 tons of breeze of which 8,239 tons were sold. Eastern ovens produced 7,884 tons of breeze and sold 4,101 tons; in Ontario 7,099 tons were made and sales totalled 3,922 tons while in the West 1,047 tons were made and 216 tons were sold.

Stocks of coke on August 31, 1940, as reported by the producers, totalled 350,998 tons, distributed as follows: 212,258 tons in Ontario, 95,732 tons in the East and 43,008 tons in the West.

In addition to the tonnage reported above, Canadian oil refineries produced 6,772 tons of petroleum coke during August. Sales of this coke amounted to 5,971 tons and producers' stocks at the end of the month totalled 2,769 tons.
