MONTHLY REPORT

COAL AND COKE STATISTICS FOR CANADA - MAY 1941

Canadian coal mines produced 1,198,255 tons during May compared with 1,214,—050 tons in the preceding month and 1,267,687 tons in May, 1940. During the month under review, bituminous coal production totalled 1,062,113 tons, sub-bituminous output 32,388 tons and lignite production, 103,754 tons.

Nova Scotia operators mined 550,634 tons in May as against 691,133 tons a year ago, Alberta mines produced 408,151 tons, made up of 319,941 tons of bituminous coal, 32,388 tons of sub-bituminous coal and 55,822 tons of lignite coal. In May, 1940, Alberta mined 249,205 tons of bituminous coal, 35,533 tons of sub-bituminous coal and 57,291 of lignite coal. Production in British Columbia declined to 146,095 tons from the May, 1940 total of 159,541 tons. Saskatchewan's output rose 69 per cent to a total of 47,932 tons from May, 1940 production. A decline of 2.4 per cent was recorded in the output from New Brunswick mines; the month's total was 45,443 tons compared with 46,586 tons a year ago.

Canada imported 1,309,690 tons of coal in May; this quantity included 317,685 tons of anthracite coal and 992,005 bituminous coal. In May, 1940, imports totalled 2,372,411 tons while the five-year average for the month was 1,510,295 tons.

Exports of Canadian coal advanced to 38,320 tons from the May, 1940 total of 34,509 tons and the 1935-1940 average for the month of 25,951 tons.

Coal made available for use in Canada in May was computed at 2,469,625 tons as against the May, 1940 supply of 3,605,589 tons.

COKE - MAY - 1941

Production of coke from coal in Canada amounted to 259,789 tons in May, an average of 8,380 tons a day. This output compares with 8,447 tons a day in April and 8,124 tons a day in May, 1940.

During the month under review 117,320 tons of Canadian coal and 242,906 tons of imported coal were carbonized in Canadian coke ovens making a total for the first five months of this year of 611,298 tons of Canadian coal and 1,153,663 tons of imported coal. From this coal 1,286,718 tons of coke was produced against 1,210,077 tons and 950,497 tons during the corresponding periods of 1940 and 1939, respectively.

Producers' stocks of coke on May 31, 1941, were reported at 243,126 tons, distributed across Canada as follows: 41,841 tons in the East, 175,629 tons in Ontario and 25,656 tons in the West.
