

## MONTHLY REPORT

COAL AND COKE STATISTICS FOR CANADA, NOVEMBER, 1944
Coal production in Canada during the month of November amounted to $1,637,863$ tons compared with $1,472,424$ tons in November, 1943. Production for the year to date totalled $15,485,897$ tons, a decrease of 4.6 per cent from the output of $16,231,847$ toms in the first eleven months of 1943. Production for this month included 984,895 tons of bituminous coal, 57,759 tons of sub-bituminous coul and 595,199 tons of lignite coal.

Nova Scotia mines produced 493,360 tona during the month compared with 537,152 tons in November, 1943. Production for the year to date totalled $5,325,034$ tons conpared with $5,594,893$ tons for the corresponding period of 1943.

New Bmunswick's production for the month amounted to 31,298 tons maicing a total of 315,151 tons for the year to aate compared with 29,316 tons and 344,358 tons for the corresponding periods of 1343.

Output for Saskatenewan during November anounted to 197,757 tons compared with 265,733 tons in Novenber, 1943. Production for the year to date totalled $1,192,117$ tons compared with $1,481,856$ tons for the same period of 1943.

Production from mines an Aloerta during the month amounted to 759,877 tons and comprised 304,666 tons of bituminous coal, 57,769 tons of sub-bituminous coal and 337,442 tons of lignite coal making a total for the year to date of 6,685,721 tons. comparative tomage for November, 1943 and the first oleven months of 1943 were 508,921 tons and 6,692,32y tons respectively.

British Columbia prounced 155,571 tons during the month compared with 131,302 tons in November of last year. Production for the first eleven months of the year totalled $1,967,874$ tons compared with $1,847,412$ tons in the same period of $194^{\prime} 3$.
of the total Dominion production for the month, Alberta contributed 46 per cent, Nova Scotia 30 per cent, Saskatchewan 12 per cent, British Columbia 10 per cent and New Brunswick 2 per cent:

Canada imported 2,610,514 tons of coal during November maxing a total of $27,496,455$ tons for the year to date, compared with $2,835,196$ tons imported during November, 1943 and $26,783,599$ toms for the first eleven months of 1943.

Exports of coal during the month amounted to 65,950 tons compared with 79,603 tons in November, 1943. Exports for the year to date totalled 928, 747 tons compared with $1,002,316$ tons for the corresponding period of last year.

Employees in the coal mines of canada numbered 24,653 during the month of October eompared with 25,841 in Oetober, 1943.

## COKE = NOVEMBER, 1944

Production oi coke from ovens and gas retorts during November amounted to 328,857 tons compared with 330,856 tons made in the previous month and 334,608 tons in November of a year ago. This month's tomage included 91,581 toms made in the eastern provinces, 214,043 tons in Ontario and 23,233 tons in the western provinces.

Charges to ovens or retorts during the month included 106,297 tons of Canadian coal and 335,310 tons of imported coal, a total of 441,607 tons.

Stocks of coke (made from coal) in the hands of producers on November 30 th, 1944 totalled 290,738 tons, located across Canada as follows: 52,758 tons in the eastern provinces, 209,090 tons in Ontario and 28,890 tons in the west.

Canadian oil refineries produced 6,197 tons of petroleun coke during Hovaider, 428 tons of which vere used in the plants, 972 tons were sold for domestic use, 2,378 tons to dealers for resale and 7,687 tons for other purposes, making a total disposition of 11,465 tons and leaving 7,330 tons on hand on doveribur $\mathbf{a}$, th, 1944.
