MONTHLY REPORT

COAL AND COKE STATISTICS FOR CANADA, OCTOBER, 1945

Canadian coal production during the month of October amounted to 1,194,386 tons, a decline of 22 per cent from the October 1944 output of 1,528,291 tons. The decrease in production was due largely to the prevalence of strikes in the coal mines of Alberta and British Columbia during the month.

Of the total October output, Nova Scotia produced 444,615 tons, Alberta 419,616 tons, Saskatchewan 220,229 tons, British Columbia 80,351 tons and New Brunswick 29,575 tons.

Production for the first ten months of the year totalled 13,138,022 tons, a decline of 5 per cent from the 13,854,729 tons produced in the corresponding period of 1944. Production for the first ten months of the year, by provinces, was as follows: Alberta 6,057,105 tons; Nova Scotia 4,261,280 tons; British Columbia 1,410,747 tons; Saskatchewan 1,105,200 tons; New Brunswick 303,690 tons.

Imports of coal into Canada during October amounted to 2,661,949 tons compared with 3,211,246 tons in October 1944. Imports for the year to date totalled 20,355,205 tons compared with 24,885,941 tons in the corresponding period of 1944.

Coal exported during the month amounted to 74,778 tons compared with 64,087 tons in October 1944. Total exports for the year to date amounted to 710,315 tons compared with 862,797 tons for the same period of 1944.

Employees in the coal mines of Canada during the month of October numbered 24,479, compared with 24,770 in October 1944.

COKE - OCTOBER - 1945

Output of coke from ovens and gas retorts in Canada during the month of October amounted to 509,963 tons compared with 318,149 tons in the previous month and 330,856 tons in October 1944. Production for the month was made up of 88,047 tons from the eastern provinces, 204,497 tons from Ontario and 17,419 tons from Western Canada.

Charges to ovens or retorts during the month included 93,347 tons of Canadian coal and 324,731 tons of imported coal.

Producers' stocks of oven and retort coke, excluding breeze, on October 31, 1945 amounted to 72,244 tons, of which 12,476 tons were located in the eastern provinces, 54,887 tons in Ontario and 4,881 tons in the western provinces. Stocks of breeze totalled 184.986 tons and were located across Canada as follows: 13,468 tons in the eastern provinces, 144,523 tons in Ontario and 26,995 tons in the western provinces.

Canadian oil refineries produced 6,503 tons of petroleum coke during October, 113 tons of which were used in the plants; 1,481 tons sold for domestic use; 550 tons sold to dealers for resale, and 4,083 tons sold for other purposes, making a total disposition of 6,227 tons and leaving 6,341 tons on hand on October 31, 1945.
