# MONTHLY REPORT

## COAL AND COKE STATISTICS FOR CANADA, MARCH, 1945

Coal production in Canada during the month of March amounted to 1,467,482 tons making a total for the year to date of 4,646,923 tons compared with 1,546,416 tons produced in March, 1944 and 4,627,068 tons for the first three months of 1944. Production for the month was made up of 1,116,616 tons of bituminous coal, 237,269 tons of sub-bituminous coal and 113,597 tons of lignite coal.

Nova Scotia produced 487,596 tons during the month making a total of 1,453,331 tons for the year to date compared with 580,186 tons in March, 1944 and 1,637,062 tons for the first three months of 1944.

New Brunswick produced 34,163 tons during the month compared with 29,706 tons in March, 1944. Production for the year to date totalled 97,699 tons compared with 81,992 tons for the same period of 1944.

Saskatchewan produced 113,597 tons during the month making a total of 464,982 tons for the year to date compared with 146,630 tons in March, 1944 and 420,736 tons in the first three months of 1944.

Alberta's output for the month amounted to 659,576 tons and was made up of 422,307 tons of bituminous coal and 237,269 tons of sub-bituminous coal. The month's production was 14 per cent higher than the Merch, 1944 output of 577,794 tons, making a total of 2,135,683 tons for the year to date compared with 1,888,493 tons for the corresponding period of last year.

British Columbia produced 172,550 tons during the month compared with 212,100 tons in March, 1944. Production for the year to date amounted to 495,228 tons compared with 598,785 tons in the same period of 1944.

Alberta contributed 45 per cent of the Dominion production for the month, Nova Scotia 33 per cent, British Columbia 12 per cent, Saskatchewan 8 per cent and New Brunswick 2 per cent.

Canada imported 934,677 tons of coal during tarch making a total of 2,515,667 tons for the year to date compared with 1,382,819 tons imported during March, 1944 and 3,693,823 tons for the first three months of 1944.

Coal exported during the month amounted to 79,138 tons compared with 79,413 tons in March, 1944. Total exports for the year to date amounted to 226,907 tons compared with 251,942 tons for the same period of 1944.

Employees in the coal mines of Canada numbered 25,352 during February compared with 27,048 in February, 1944.

#### COKE - MARCH, 1945

Output of coke from ovens and gas retorts in Canada during the month of March amounted to 341,793 tons compared with 314,083 tons in the previous month and 355,708 tons in March, 1944. Production for the month was made up of 91,691 tons from the eastern provinces, 224,890 tons from Ontario and 25,212 tons from Western Canada.

Charges to ovens or retorts during the month included 105,280 tons of Canadian coal and 327,577 tons of imported coal.

Producers' stocks of oven and retort coke, excluding breeze, on March 31, 1945 amounted to 77,046 tons of which 19,615 tons were located in the eastern provinces, 45,382 tons in Ontario and 12,049 tons in the western provinces. Stocks of breeze totalled 174,530 tons and were located across Canada as follows: 12,690 tons in the eastern provinces, 147,474 tons in Ontario and 14,366 tons in the western provinces.

Canadian oil refineries produced 2,942 tons of petroleum coke during March, 310 tons of which were used in the plants, 751 tons sold for domestic use, 3,082 tons sold for other purposes, making a total disposition of 4,143 tons and leaving 8,351 tons on hand at March 31.
