COAL

NOVEMBER 1928

Coal production in Canada during November was slightly less than in October but was 1 per cent greater than the average for the month in the five preceding years. For the first eleven months of the calendar year 1928 the output was 15 per cent in advance of the average for the period in the five preceding years. The output for the month was 1,694,572 short tons including 1,081,379 tons of bituminoue ccal, 69,819 tons of sub-bituminous coal, and 543,374 tons of lignite coal. Nova Scotia produced 604,953 tons; New Brunswick 19,569 tons; Saskatchewan's output amounted to 68,697 tons; Alberta produced 756,154 tons, including 211,658 tons of bituminous coal, 69,819 tons of sub-bituminous coal and 474,677 tons of lignite coal; and British Columbia's output was 245,199 tons.

The ccal producing provinces of New Brunswick, Saekatchewan, Alberta and British Columbia showed increases in production over the preceding month. Nova Scotia's output decreased 11 per cent.

Imports of coal into Canada during November amounted to 1,890,020 tons including 1,807,954 tons from the United States and 82,066 tons from Great Britain. By kinds of coal the imports were, anthracite, 418,212 tons; bituminous, 1,470,683 tons; and lignite, 1,125 tons. Imports in October totalled 2,092,214 tons.

Exports of coal in November amounted to 79,545 tons comprising 42,324 tons through the ports of the eastern provinces and 37,221 tons from the western provinces.

Coal made available for use in Canada during November amounted to 3.505,047 tons, comprising 2,478,430 tons of bituminous coal; 418,212 of anthracite coal; 69,819 tons of sub-bituminous coal; and 538,586 tons of lignite coal. Classified according to origin the tonnage of coal made available for consumption was divided as follows: from Canadian mines, 1,007,747 tons of bituminous, 69,819 tons of sub-bituminous, 537,461 tons of lignite; from the United States, 1,437,688 tons of bituminous, 369,141 tons of anthracite and 1,125 tons of lignite; from Great Britain, 32,995 tons of bituminous and 49,071 tons of anthracite.

Production of coke in Canada during November totalled 204,568 tons. This was nearly 3 per cent under the record of 210,120 tons made in October, but was higher than in any other month on record. In November 1927, the output was 159,330 tons. Coke breeze included in the above production figure amounted to 13,592 tons of which 8,189 tons was from plants in Ontario. Sales of breeze for Canada totalled 4,936 tons and for Ontario 3,816 tons.

Comparison with figures for the previous month shows that, in November, production in the eastern provinces declined to 68,447 tons from 72,060 tons; output in Ontario dropped slightly to 121,378 tons from 122,540 tons and in the western provinces the tonnage was 14,743 as against 15,520 for October.

Reports on the disposition of coke by the producing companies showed that coke sales advanced to 82,367 tons from 79,735 tons; deliveries to matallurgical works increased to 99,048 tons from 98,798 tons while consumption in the coke plants declined slightly to 20,121 tons from 20,797 tons. The total disposition of coke for November was 201,532 tons.

Charges to coke ovens during the month included 81,791 tons of Canadian coal and 202,014 tons of imported coal, or a total of 283,805 tons of bituminous coal. For the year to date 2,916,922 tons of coal were carbonized to produce 2,095,238 tons of coke.

Imports of coke during November totalled 127,400 tone, which with the Caanadian production of 204,568 tons made an available supply of 331,968 tons; but 1,284 tons were exported, leaving 330,684 tons as the apparent consumption in Canada during November. For the year to date, the apparent consumption, thus computed, was 3,027,905 tons.

Coke actually charged to iron blast furnaces in November amounted to 104,573 tons. For the eleven months the total reached 1,015,589 tons.
