COAL

AUGUST 1928

Coal production in Canada during August was 17.2 per cent higher than in July and 29 per cent greater than the average for the month in the five preceding years. For the first eight months of the calendar year 1928 the output was 17 per cent in advance of the average for the period in the five preceding years. The output for the month was 1,535,065 short tons including 1,247,091 tons of bituminous coal, 65,837 tons of sub-bituminous coal, and 222,137 tons of lignite ceal. Mova Scotia produced 665,639 tons; New Brunswick, 16,178 tons; Saskatchewan's output amounted to 21,328 tons; Alberta produced 605,055 tons, including 338,409 tons of bituminous coal, 65,837 tons of sub-bitumineus coal and 200,809 tons of lignite coal; and British Columbia's output was 226,865 tons.

All provinces showed increases in production over the preceding month. Nova Scotia gained 10 per cent; New Brunswick mined 9 per cent more coal; Saskatchewan's increase was 30 per cent; Alberta's output was 26.8 per cent in advance of the previous month; and British Columbia showed a gain of 15 per cent.

Imports of coal into Canada during August amounted to 2,009,525 tons including 1,904,542 tons from the United States and 104,983 tons from Great Britain. By kinds of coal the imports were, anthracite, 324,456 tons; bituminous, 1,684,596 tons; and lignite 473 tons. Imports in July totalled 1,494,061 tons.

Exports of coal in August amounted to 72,513 tons comprising 35,251 tons through the ports of the eastern provinces and 37,262 tons from the western provinces.

Coal made available for use in Canada during August amounted to 3,472,077 tons, comprising 2,859,896 tons of bituminous coal; 324,456 tons of anthracite coal, 65,837 tons of sub-bituminous coal, and 221,888 tons of lignite coal. Classified according to origin the tonnage of coal made available for consumption was divided as follows: from Canadian mines, 1,175,300 tons of bituminous; 65,837 tons of sub-bituminous; 221,415 tons of lignite; from the United States, 1,668,021 tons of bituminous; 236,048 tons of anthracite and 473 tons of lignite; from Great Britain, 16,575 tons of bituminous and 88,408 tons of anthracite.

COKE

Production of coke in Canada during August totalled 191,284 tons which was 4 per cent under the output of 200,016 tons in the previous month but 12 per cent above the total of 171,525 tons in August of a year ago. Compared with data for the previous month, August figures showed that in Nova Scotia, New Brunswick and Quebec production fell off to 59,593 tons from 60,651 tons; in Ontario, the output declined to 118,223 tons from 126,786 tons; but in the western provinces the tonnage was increased to 13,468 tons from 12,579 tons. Coke breeze included in the above figures amounted to 13,247 tons of which 4,678 tons were produced in the eastern provinces, 7,523 tons in Ontario and 1,046 tons in western ovens.

Statements on the disposition of coke by the makers showed that shipments to the producing companies' associated smelters declined to 99,710 tons in August from 109,809 tons in July; consumption in coke plants was 18,748 tons as compared with 18,546 tons, and coke sales showed a seasonal gain to 52,256 tons from 40,436 tons in the next preceding month. Sales of breeze included in the above figures totalled 4,227 tons of which 1,081 tons were sold by producers in the eastern provinces, 2,596 tons from units in Ontario and 550 tons from western plants.

Charges to coke ovens during the month included 68.380 tons of Canadian coal and 200,609 tons of imported coal or a total of 268,989 tons of bituminous coal. For the eight months ending August 31, 1926, a total of 2,069,471 tons of bituminous coal were carbonized to produce 1,486,491 tons of coke.

Customs records show that 82,889 tons of coke were imported into Canada during August which with the Canadian production of 191,284 tons made an available supply of 274,173 tons but as 1,603 tons were exported the apparent consumption of coke in Canada during August was 272,570 tons. For the first eight months of the year the apparent consumption, thus computed, was 2,082,197 tons.

Coke charged to iron blast furnaces in August amounted to 95,998 tons, to rake a total of 709,103 tons for the year to date.
