COAL

JULY 1931

Canadian mines produced 826.156 tons of coal in July; a decline of 34 4 per cent from the five year average for the month of 1.259.330 tons. July's output was made up of 717.196 tons of bituminous coal. 71,972 tons of lignite coal and 36,988 tons of sub-bituminous coal. Nova Scotia's production totalled 395,240 tons or 47 8 per cent of the total Canadian production. Alberta min-d 260.339 tons, British Columbia, 141,239 tons, Saskatchewan, 16,407 tons, and New Brunswick, 12,931 tons.

Imports of coal into Canada amounted to 1,245,095 tons or 30.4 per cent below the 1926-1930 average for the month of 1,788.570 tons. Receipts of anthracite coal were recorded at 334,661 tons of which the United States supplied 194,379 tons, Great Britain 135,868 tons, and Germany 4,414 tons.

Bituminous coal imports reached a total of 910,251 tons, consisting of 899,095 tons from the United States and 11,156 tons from Great Britain. Lignite coal imports were recorded at 183 tons.

Canadian coal exported during July amounted to 35,603 tons or 35.4 per cent below the average for the month during the past five years.

Coal made available for consumption in July totalled 2,035,648 tons of which tonnage the United States supplied 53.7 per cent, Canada, 38 9 per cent; Great Britain, 7.2 per cent, and Germany 0.2 per cent. The five-year average for the month was 2,992,794 tons.

COKE

Production of coke in Canada during July totalled 138,830 tons. This output was at the rate of 4,478 tons per day as compared with a daily average of 5,166 tons in June and 5,875 tons in July of a year ago.

Compared with the previous menth, the figures for July showed a loss of 10 per cent when output was lower in all producing areas with the exception of the western provinces where it rose slightly to 14,188 tons from 13,032 tons. In the eastern provinces output dropped to 42,297 tons from 46,554 tons and in Ontario to 82,345 tons from 95,380 tons.

Output for July included 11,068 tons of breeze of which 3,604 tons were made in the eastern provinces, 6,537 tons in Ontario and 927 tons in the west. Sales of breeze totalled 3,338 tons including 337 tons from eastern ovens, 2,477 tons from Ontario, and 524 tons by western producers.

Disposition of coke during July was reported by the makers at 119,928 tons, a slight falling-off from the total of 121,097 tons disposed of in the previous month. Coke sales advanced to 58,576 tons from 47,076 tons but this advance was more than offset by the decline in the tonnage transferred to associated smelters of the producing companies to 41,460 tons from 51,369 tons and the drop in the quantity used by coke pla ts to 19,892 tons from 22,652 tons.

Coke oven charges during the month included 42,744 tons of Canadian coal and 149,940 tons of imported coal, or a total of 192,684 tons of coal. For the year to date oven charges aggregated 1,582,728 tons of bituminous coal to make 1,147,413 tons of coke.

The apparent consumption of coke in July, as determined by deducting the exports from the sum of the production and the imports amounted to 193,140 tons when imports were reported at 55,756 tons and exports at 1,446 tons. In July, 1930, the apparent consumption was 270,256 tons, imports 90,713 tons, and exports, 2,575 tons.

Coke charged to iron blast furnaces during the month under review amounted to 41,451 tons to make a total of 354,448 tons for the year to date.
