COAL

JUNE, 1932.

Coal production in Canada during June reached a total of 749,453 tons, a decline of 39.6 per cent from the 1927-1931 average for the month of 1,239,871 tons. The output of bituminous coal in June amounted to 663,491 tons, of subbituminous coal, 20,870 tons and of lignite coal, 65,092 tons.

Nov Scotis mines produced 361,199 tons as compared with 431,725 tons in June, 1931. Output from Alberta mines declined to 228,897 tons from the total of 286,915 tons produced in the corresponding month of 1931. British Columbia's production in June was 129,776 tons as against 194,683 tons a year ago. Mines in the bruns sick produced 14,687 tons and in Saskatchewan, 14,675 tons as compared with the June 1931 output of 10,920 tons and 17,892 tons, respectively.

Canada's imports of coal continue at a lower level than in preceding years. In June, 958,742 tons were imported, a 45.5 per cent falling—off from the five-year average for the month of 1,760,387 tons. Anthracite coal imports totalled 15,156 tons, made up of 146,657 tons from Great Britain, 100,816 tons from the United States and 5,693 tons from Germany. Receipts of bituminous coal consisted of 671,064 tons from the United States and 34,391 tons from Great Britain. Importations of lightee coal in June amounted to 151 tons.

Canadian coal exports declined 78.3 per cent to 13,771 tons as compared with the June 1927-1931 average of 65,356 tons. The June exports included 8,954 tons from Nova Scotia and New Brunswick and 4,817 tons cleared through Manitoba, Alb rta and British Columbia ports.

Co. 1 made available for consumption in Canada in June was 1,694,424 tons or 42.3 for cent below the average for the month during the past five years of 2,936,902 tons. During the month under review 253,166 tons of anthracite coal, 1.355,185 tons of bituminous coal, 20,870 tons of sub-bituminous coal and 65,200 tons of lignite coal were made available for use in Canada. This supply down from the following sources: the United States, 45.6 per cent; Canadian mines, 43.4 per cent; Great Britain, 10.7 per cent; and Germany, 0.3 per cent.

COKE

Froduction of by product and gas house coke in Canada at 118,719 tons during June was considerably less than the 154,966 tons made in the corresponding month of last year but only 8 per cent under the 129,194 tons reported for May of this year. Statements on the disposition of coke as furnished by the producers show that although domestic and foundry sales were lower than in May, the principal drop was in the quantity of toke transferred to the makers' own smelters, this item falling to 22,467 tons from 28,987 tons.

June cutput figures included 10.545 tons of breeze of which 3.179 tons were made in the eastern provinces, 6,294 tons in Ontario and 870 tons in the west. Sales of breeze amounted to 3,056 tons of which 1,020 tons were sold by eastern ovens, 1,448 tons by Ontario producers and 588 tons by the western provinces.

Charges to Canadian coke ovens during the month included 31,028 tons of Canadian coal and 133,346 tons of imported coal or a total of 164,374 tons of bituminous coal. For the six months ending June 50, 1932, a notal of 1,155,189 tons of coal were carbonized in Canada to produce 841,555 tons of coke.
