CIVIL AVIATION
NOVEMBER, 1941.

Passenger traffic by air for November declined to 11,202 revenue passengers carried from 17,027 carried in October or by 34 p.c.

Revenue freight declined from 2,452,085 lbs. in October to 460,364 lbs. and mail from 307,103 to 243,002 lbs.

Revenue passenger miles flown declined from 5,252,064 in October to 3,690,239 or by 30 p.c., indicating an increase in the average journey from 308 to 339 miles.

Aircraft hours flown in all services dropped from 9;124 in October to 5,549 or by 39 p.c., and gasoline consumption declined from 395,480 gallons to 288,064 gallons or by 27 p.c. for a decrease in horse power hours of 24 p.c. The decrease in flying was evidently with the smaller aircraft.

An error was made in the October report by duplicating data for one carrier. Please substitute the enclosed revised report for the report issued last month.
