CIVIL AVIATION

MARCH, 1941.

Air carriers in Canada reported a total of 1,219,311 aircraft miles flown in March as against 1,060,379 miles in February. Revenue passengers carried increased from 10,634 in February to 11,884, revenue freight from 1,394,149 to 1,449,596 lbs. and mail from 263,697 to 292,199 lbs.

Comparing data for the first quarters of 1940 and 1941 revenue passengers carried increased from 28,002 to 33,074 or by 18 p.c., revenue freight from 2,549,633 to 4,366,381 lbs. or by 72 p.c., and mail from 739,082 to 819,101 lbs. or by 11 p.c.

The average passenger journey was increased from 217 miles in 1940 to 290 miles, increasing the revenue passenger miles by 58 p.c. Mail ton miles was increased by 45 p.c. and revenue freight ton miles by 60 p.c.

The consumption of gasoline increased from 750,607 gallons to 1,054,408 gallons or by 40 p.c. and of lubricating oil from 14,415 to 24,215 gallons or 60 p.c.

The average monthly number of employees of Canadian companies was 1,586 in 1941 as against 1,202 in 1940, and the pay roll for the quarter increased from \$525,469 to \$711,149.

Miles flown for aircraft, passengers, freight and mail are only miles from point to point and do not include any estimated mileage flown in patrol work, advertising, instruction and similar flights. Mileages for international companies include only mileages over Canadian territory and not the total mileages of international flights. Baggage carried free on the passengers' tickets is not counted but excess baggage is included with freight.

Mail includes all mail carried for the Canadian or foreign post office departments over Canadian territory. Mail carried over two or more mail routes without delivery to the post office for re-sorting is counted only once.


