CIVIL AVIATION APRIL, 1941.

Passenger traffic of air lines continued to grow, amounting to 12,507 revenue passengers and 4,248,314 passenger miles as against 11,884 passengers carried and 3,498,465 passenger miles for March.

Passenger revenue was up from March by \$35,335 or 15 p.c. but mail revenue was down by \$72,323 or 22 p.c. and other transportation revenue was down by \$36,910 or 33 p.c. Incidental revenues were up by 12,036 or 31 p.c., lowering total revenues to \$651,065 as against \$712,927 in March.

Gasoline consumed by all operators amounted to 363,853 gallons and lubricating oil to 8,110 gallons.

The number of employees increased from 1,601 in Murch to 1,660 and the pay roll amounted to \$245,773.

Miles flown for aircraft, passengers, freight and mail are only miles from point to point and do not include any estimated mileage flown in patrol work, advertising, instruction and similar flights. Mileages for international companies include only mileages over Canadian territory and not the total mileages of international flights. Baggage carried free on the passengers' tickets is not counted but excess baggage is included with freight.

Mail includes all mail carried for the Canadian or foreign post office departments over Canadian territory. Mail carried over two or more mail routes without delivery to the post office for re-sorting is counted only once.
